

What is the BRFSS?

- The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is the world's largest continuously conducted telephone survey, coordinated by the CDC.
- It covers personal behaviors that are linked to the leading causes of death and other important health issues including chronic illness, premature mortality, and other health-related topics.
- All 50 states, Puerto Rico, Guam, the Virgin Islands, and Washington D.C. participate.
- Clark participated in the county level BRFSS studies sponsored by Hometown Health.




Results

Cigarette Smoking


Persons who are current smokers: Clark County (2011), Arkansas & US (2010).


Alcohol use

Overweight & Obese


Persons who are overweight & obese as measured by BMI 25 or more: Clark County (2011), Arkansas & US (2010).

Physical Activity


Persons who did not participate in any physical activity in past 30 days besides activity related to regular job: Clark County (2011), Arkansas & US (2009).

General Health


Persons who reported general health as “fair” or “poor”: Clark County (2011), Arkansas & US (2010).

Health Care Access



High Blood Pressure


Persons who reported they have been diagnosed with high blood pressure: Clark County (2011), Arkansas & US (2010).

Diabetes


Persons who reported they have been diagnosed with diabetes: Clark County (2011), Arkansas & US (2010).

Myocardial Infarction (Heart Attack)


Persons who reported they had been diagnosed with a myocardial infarction: Clark County (2011), Arkansas & US (2010).


Persons who reported they had been diagnosed with a stroke: Clark County (2011), Arkansas & US (2010).

Permanent Teeth Extraction


Persons who reported they have had permanent teeth extracted due to tooth decay or gum disease: Clark County (2011), Arkansas & US (2010).

Last Dental Visit


Persons who reported last dental visit was one year or more ago: Clark County (2011), Arkansas & US (2010).

Fruits and Vegetables


Persons who reported they consumed fewer than 5 fruits and vegetables per day: Clark County (2011), Arkansas & US (2009).

Mammogram


Women over 40 years who reported they had not had a mammogram in the past two years: Clark County (2011), Arkansas & US (2010).

What is the County Health Survey?

A County Health Survey is a questionnaire used to collect and evaluate personal risk behaviors that may affect the health of Arkansans. The County Health Survey may focus on adults - County Adult Health Survey - or on the youth - County Youth Health Survey. The County Health Surveys are conducted in cooperation with the Hometown Health Improvement (HHI) initiative.
