Dani Ennis

- Provided a smokeless tobacco presentation to an 8th grade health class at Westside Junior High School. Students were educated on the risks of smokeless tobacco and the addictive powers and marketing to youth. Also discussed ACT 811 and how cigarette smoke is harmful to the smoker and people around them. Lastly, discussed how smoking harms the body and hinders athletic performance and depletes nutrition.
- Tobacco Puppet Shows for K-4 grade students provided at Rector Elementary School
