Clay Co

- A presentation was made to 150 Kindergarten – 2nd graders at Piggott Elementary on the “Harms of Tobacco” using Donnie the Dinosaur DVD as well as education on Act 811.

Cleburne Co

- A presentation was made to Quitman Head Start on how to form healthy habits and stay warm during winter months. Approximately 20 children and 3 staff were present.
- Heber Springs Head Start were educated on how to form healthy habits and stay warm during the winter months with approximately 20 children and 2 staff attending.

Craighead Co

- Approximately 45 8th grade Westside students were educated on STD’s and Teen Pregnancies. Other topics discussed were: FAS and Tobacco Harms to the fetus.
- A presentation was made to approximately 52 students at University Heights School about the importance of Nutrition/Oral Health and Tobacco Harms using the “Donnie the Dinosaur” DVD.
- Over an 8 day period, University Heights students – 1st & 2nd graders were educated on the Dangers of Tobacco and Tobacco Prevention. Other topics covered were: Nutrition and Taking Care of Your Teeth. Included a puppet show in several of these presentations. Approximately 285 students were in attendance during this time.
- A presentation was made to Consolidated Youth Services on “Chew Tobacco.” Encouraged students to never use tobacco and/or to quit using tobacco products. Shared handouts pertaining to more information on Smokeless Tobacco as well as pledges. There were approximately 50 students in attendance.
- Educated health consultants at a Healthy Mixer Event on healthier eating and cooking tips. Recipes were shared and handouts on caloric intake and Act 811 cards were given for parents in attendance.

- Education was provided to approximately 260 students at Wynne High School on Wellness/Tobacco Prevention/Cessation/Act 811/Tobacco Harms/SOS Quit Line/Act 811. Assistance was also provided with Scoliosis Screenings for the students.

- Education was provided to approximately 150 2nd & 4th grade students at Oak Grove School on “Harms of Tobacco” and “Act 811”.
- Educated 4 nurses from the Health Department on CPR. Other topics covered were: Tobacco Harms and the heart.
