Let's give tobacco "the boot" out of boot country!</p> <p>Trooper Kevin Grows: Act 811 Enforcer of the Year Congratulations to Arkansas State Trooper First Class Kevin Grows for being selected Act 811 Enforcer of the Year! Trooper Grows was recently commended at the annual Law Enforcement Appreciation Luncheon for writing four Act 811 citations since April 2013. Act 811 of 2011 is a law designed to protect children from secondhand smoke. It prohibits smoking in the vehicles when children under 14 are present. In Conway County, fines and court costs for this offense total about \$245. This is a brand new award. As an adjunct to the Act 811 education she has been doing this year, Ms. Neeley wanted to do something special to recognize Act 811 law enforcement efforts. To do this, she developed an award name, and then contacted all law enforcement offices to get Act 811 ticket history. Special recognition is being given for enforcing this law in particular because it is not very well-known, and it is fairly difficult to catch someone breaking it. When asked whether those he ticketed were initially pulled over for breaking Act 811, or if the citation was secondary to another offense, Trooper Grows confirmed he was pulling them over <i>specifically</i> for breaking Act 811. He said he grew up with secondhand smoke exposure himself, so it has been a passion of his to help prevent this from happening to other children. Obviously, he has been keeping a very a watchful eye in order to help keep our children healthy. Thank you for being an outstanding Enforcer Trooper Grows! We feel honored to have you as a "protector" of our community and guardian over our little ones!</p> <p>Tobacco Addiction and Art Contest Winners Announced Community Service, Inc. and the University of Arkansas Community College at Morrilton are proud to announce the winners of a Tobacco and Addiction and Art Contest held recently on the college campus. 		<p>Community Service, Inc. and the University of Arkansas Community College at Morrilton, as an initiative of an Arkansas Department of Health Academic Tobacco Prevention Grant for Conway County. The awards were funded by the grant. Melinda Neeley, Academic Tobacco Prevention Coordinator for Conway County who works for Community Service, Inc., spearheaded the project. Cody Davis, UACCM Disabilities Counselor, helped direct and promote the contest on campus. Contest judges were Shawwna Bowles, Executive Director of the Rialto Community Arts Center in Morrilton, and Coe Wilson, a local artist, both members of the Conway County Arts Council.</p> <p>Each year, almost 500,000 deaths occur in the U.S. as a result of smoking. In Arkansas alone, smoking claims more than 5,100 lives annually. The purpose of this contest was to contribute to the concept that creativity and artistic expression can play a significant role both in recovery and in raising awareness of the personal and community tolls caused by tobacco abuse and addiction. Artwork can give insight into the human experience of addiction, by sparking dialogs, teaching, and changing perceptions.</p> <p>The winning artwork of Ms. Pharr and Ms. Oade was featured during a Tobacco Addiction and Art Exhibit in early May at UACCM's E. Allen Gordon Library.</p> <p>Here's a Roundup of Tobacco Roundup! As part of the Academic Tobacco Prevention Grant work for Conway County in 2013-14, 77 tobacco prevention events/presentations were conducted; 1,520 tobacco-free pledges were secured; 19 fax-back referrals were obtained; and approximately 8,250 persons were served. In addition, approximately 7,500 Petit Jean Country Headlight subscribers, 15,000 KVOM listeners and 550 email readers were reached during multiple media campaigns.</p> <p><i>Note: The Tobacco Addiction and Art booth that Ms. Neeley conducted at UACCM to promote the contest won a statewide award for "Best Interactive Booth" from the Arkansas Department of Health's Tobacco Prevention & Cessation Program.
