The Madison County Health Coalition's TCPC Project Coordinator is now working with surrounding counties so that is why other counties activities are listed on my report. Our coalition is responsible for the work so I am including it on our report.

The ECHO clinic staff in Eureka Springs received the Brief Tobacco Intervention (BTI) training. They will send the clients who smoke or use spit tobacco to the grantee for education and to receive a CO reading. MCHC has collaborated with Hope Cancer Resource and if the clients do not wish to fill out a fax referral then they can receive a voucher from Hope Cancer to take to their doctor and get a prescription for tobacco cessation medication. This is proving to be very successful for the ECHO clinic.

Berryville Sheriff Department was educated about Act 811. It is a primary in Arkansas prohibiting smoking in cars with children in Arkansas under the age of 14. There were 12 officers and they were very receptive and excited to receive the information about the act.

During Red Ribbon Rally Week the Jasper elementary students were all wrapped up in a red ribbon celebrating being tobacco free. MCHC was able to distribute red arm bands to the Jasper school K-12 with the slogan, Being Tobacco Free in my Community. This is the first year for Jasper to partner with the MCHC and it was a great success.

Berryville and partnering organizations conducted an eighth grade teen summit for the Berryville school district. The tobacco grantee for MCHC was invited to open the summit with a power point about the dangers of tobacco use and who is Big Tobacco. The 272 students were very interested in learning about the subject and were very receptive to the education. There were 207 of the students that took the tobacco free pledge.

Oark school invited the MCHC grantee to come and present to the elementary students during the week of Red Ribbon Rally Week. The grantee presented Big Tobacco advertising and targeting youth to grades 3-6th, Who is Big Tobacco to 7-8th and Donnie the Dinosaur tobacco troubles to K-3rd grade. The students were very interactive and were happy to receive the education. All of the school was supplied with arm bands.

During the week of Red Ribbon Week, Berryville schools conducted anti-tobacco
