They were given handouts and were able to complete one of the modules together. Educated on programs for tobacco cessation and prevention of teen pregnancies.
- Educated 5 classes (115 students) at Fulbright Jr High in Bentonville on nutrition and digestion. They learned how food is absorbed and digested through GI tract. Also educated the students on the effects of tobacco on all systems of the body (not just lungs and mouth).
- Educated 308 3rd-5th grade students at Elmdale Elementary on oral health. Presentations were given 11 times. Students were taught how to brush and floss teeth correctly, why we should avoid too much sugar and eat more fruits/veggies, avoid tobacco, and the importance of using a mouth guard during certain sports.
- Educated 9 Hispanic moms at the Parson Hills Elementary Family Literacy Program. They learned how to plan healthy meals, stay on a budget, and organize recipes. The moms were also educated on water/life jacket safety for the upcoming warm weather. They were given life jacket "wear it" stickers.

- Educated 14 expecting mothers and 11 other participants at the Springdale School District Archer Learning Center about home safety for babies. Education included poisoning, smoking, choking, burns, and falls. Each person was given a poison control hotline sticker
