**Ashley:**

Participated in the Wilmot Walking Trail event, 65 participants, Educated citizens on importance of walking, and physical activity.

**Cleveland:**

Participated in the Progressive Agriculture Safety Day. An ATV Safety presentation was given to 5<sup>th</sup> grade students from Cleveland County School District "Trip Unplanned" –presented to 5 different groups-(61 students & 6 teachers)

Cleveland County Head Start Program-Healthy Hoedown event- The Nurse Practitioner showed the attendees (60 parents and 20 staff-total 80) how to check a child's temperature correctly and when and when not to access the ER along with other health tips. Injury prevention topics such as poison prevention, Diet and tooth decay, making the home a safer place, bicycle safety and many more was shared with attendees. Tobacco Prevention and education was given to all participants including Tobacco use and asthma, Act 811 and the quit line.

**Desha:**

A diabetes event was held at Clearwater Paper Mill. 198 employees were screened and were provided with information on how to manage and control diabetes. There was one participant that was screened and sent directly to doctor. That person has been placed on meds and is currently doing well.

An informational booth was at the annual homecoming community event for Owl Fest. Materials were distributed on Family Planning, WIC, Immunizations, Flu and Injury Prevention. Participants also received the PBS activity books.

**Prairie:**

Plans are being made to have various school events. The Bat Mobile is one program that will be focusing on drug and alcohol prevention. This took place during Red Ribbon Week. A collaboration between community partners provided red ribbons to all students in Hazen and Des Arc.
