

## NE Region HHI Monthly Report for April 2011

### Clay County—

- Piggott Elementary School Health Fair, April 19<sup>th</sup> Tobacco information shared
- LHUA assisted County Extension Office with Reshape Program; did weight; ins; measurements; & BMI
- LHUA contacted school about Pam Stenzel presentation
- School T-dap clinics scheduled with letters delivered

### Cleburne County—

- Kelli Dunegan completed tobacco education training for the coalition members, presentation on the dangers of second-hand smoke, smoking, smokeless tobacco and ACT 13 as well as the upcoming new ACT 11.
- CHNS, Mary Glasscock presented to West Side School, 50 attendees, on tobacco info: ACT 811, Dangers of Secondhand Smoke, & cessation
- CHNS, Marilyn Cone distributed to Concord School District, two Zobey, and “Jungle Jive” DVDs that will impact 75 preschool students.

### Craighead County—

- Safety Baby Shower, goal to educate first time moms on how to take care of their baby to decrease infant mortality rates in AR. “Safe to Sleep & Crying Baby; Breastfeeding; Poison; Home Safety; and tobacco use during pregnancy; car seat safety; the importance of immunizations; and What To Do When Your Baby is Sick were all discussed. 35 car seats (Jonesboro Police Dept.) were given to moms and grandparents. There were approx. 50 attendees.
- PHE, Kim McCray presented “Resource from the AR Dept. of Health” at the 2011 Statewide Family Child Care Conference, to approximately 20 attendees. Info shared general public health; immunization; injury prevention; nutrition; physical activity; tobacco/smoking cessation; and hand washing.
- Kim created and posted a flyer encouraging parents to schedule their child’s immunization appointment especially five year olds planning to attend kindergarten.
- CHNS, Laura Cook presented information on intravenous drug use specifically relating to Hepatitis and PHE, Kim McCray presented info on STDs as a result of risky behaviors to Drug Courts in Jonesboro, 12 attendees.
- An injury prevention display was setup in the waiting room for Public Health Week; focus was on ATV safety and a Trip Unplanned ATV safety video was showed as well.

### Cross County—

- The Coalition is accepting bids for work on new walking trail, hopefully will be completed by the summer.

### Fulton County—

- Continues to do inspections and install car seats
- Continues to provide UAMS Medicine Assistance Program located in the Fulton County Hospital, applications are increasing each day
- The Prevention Resource Centers funding has paid for PSAs on tobacco use on KSAR Radio station.
- Working with Fulton County Judge Charles Willett, Sheriff Buck Foley, 16<sup>th</sup> Judicial Drug Task Force, and the “Drug Take Back Day” was April 20<sup>th</sup> and held at the Sheriff’s Office.
- Table with safety information setup in the lobby of LHU and in the Fulton County Library, along with information and poster given to the Fulton County Hospital for them to use during Safety Month.
- Marilyn Cone provided presentations to 86 at the Viola School District on Injury Prevention, showing ATV Safety DVD, “A Trip Unplanned”, and educated students on Water Safety and helmet safety. Tobacco presentation also included to 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> graders. The school later showed ATV Safety DVD to 7<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> graders and distributed handouts. These presentations will impact over 500 students and staff.

### Greene County—

- Operation SAVE Lives, checking cars at intersections of 49 and Court Street in Paragould to see if everyone’s seat belts were in use. If the car’s occupants had seat belts on they were given lifesavers. If they were not engaged the

occupants were given dum dum suckers and if they were smoking they were given information about the Quit-line and Second-hand smoke info, was completed April 4<sup>th</sup>

- April 12<sup>th</sup> Senior Bee's Senior Citizen Center, Paragould. PHE, Kim McCray assisted with paperwork for Tetanus shots and provided TPCP materials on tobacco use & cardiovascular health and smoking & your health, 50 attendees. This was done in collaboration with Linda Hutchison, LHUA
- April 20<sup>th</sup> Immunization for preschoolers
- School of 21<sup>st</sup> Century
- April 28<sup>th</sup> A-dap Clinic at Greene County Tech
- CHNS, Karen Davis, presented the "Emerging Tobacco Products" presentation to the CSH members. This brought much participation from audience and emails for presentation at upcoming events showed evaluation of program to be educational and needed. 20 attendees. Paragould Community Center.
- April 29<sup>th</sup>, CHNS, Karen Davis, worked a booth on Poultry and Beef with the Cooperative Extension Office for an "Ag in the Classroom Day." Nutritional values were discussed and the effect on the body. Tobacco prevention info was also shared. 250 attendees.

### **Independence County—**

- April 5<sup>th</sup> Marilyn Cone, CHNS, & Tammy Robertson, UAMS/AHEC Respiratory Therapist, provided an Asthma presentation for staff development Batesville School District teachers. Participants educated on the harmful effects of smoking, ACT 811 of 2011 & second-hand smoke. Each participant received the Asthma Inhaler ACT 1694 of 2005 regulations. This presentation will impact over 3,200 students and staff. Sonia Nix, Independence County LHUA provided technical assistance in providing this workshop. The WOMEN's HEALTH DISPLAY was utilized.
- April 6<sup>th</sup> Cheria Smith, Indep. Co. PHN & Marilyn Cone, CHNS, partnered to present four classroom presentations on STD/teen pregnancy/abstinence to Batesville 9<sup>th</sup> grade students. Participants were also educated on ACT 13, the harmful effects of Spit tobacco and second-hand smoke. Cherie educated on Gardasil vaccine, family planning and STD data for the county. 122, 9<sup>th</sup> graders, 2 nursing students and 1 teacher attended, with Sonia Nix, LHUA, supplying technical assistance with STD and family planning materials.
- April 6<sup>th</sup> Marilyn Cone, CHNS, partnered with Gary Ragen, Statewide Injury Prevention Program Coordinator, to provide a presentation for staff development for the Batesville School District teachers. ATV kits, which included DVDs, posters, pamphlets, and Power point, were distributed to teachers. The packets included handouts on teen driving safety, cell phone safety, safety belts, Bicycle safety, child car safety, burn prevention, helmet safety, home safety checklist, life jackets vs. life preservers, walking safety, watercraft safety, teens: stay safe behind the wheel, and water safety were distributed to teachers through out the school district. The school designated April 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> for injury prevention with students and staff. The ATV/DVD will be shown at the Alternative school to special education students and in health classes. The impact will be 3,200. Sonia Nix, LHUA, provided TA. The WOMEN's HEALTH DISPLAY was used.
- April 11<sup>th</sup> at Lyon College in Batesville, a collaborative between Mariesa Bolin, Independence Co. Public Health Nurse and Marilyn Cone, CHNS, created a presentation on STD/Abstinence presentation with showing "Sex Still Has a Price Tag" to 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students in the Apple Project, Upward Bound. Info on statistics, Gardasil vaccine and family planning was also provided to 80 students and 3 instructors. Displays used were WOMEN'S HEALTH and STDs. Students included Batesville; Southside; Cave City; Tuckerman; Mountain View; Cedar Ridge; Newport and Midland students. Impact should be appropriately 600 students.
- April 11<sup>th</sup>, Floral, Midland School District, Indep. Co., Marilyn Cone & Sonia Nix, LHUA made up packets including ACT 13 postcards; tobacco pamphlets; immunization magnets and immunization schedule for birth through 6 years; and other info on WIC and various programs. Packets will impact approximately 60 students.
- April 19<sup>th</sup>, Parents as Teachers group, Cherie Smith, Indep. Co. PHN and Marilyn Cone, CHNS, presented on STD/family planning and infant mortality to teen mothers, pregnant teens and parents; sharing info on nutrition including folic acid; WIC; family planning, T-DAP and STDs. Impact will include 35 families in the Parent as Teachers' Program.
- April 19th, Women's Health Display was displayed at the Independence County Hometown Wellness Coalition and the Communities Putting Prevention to Work Meetings. 13 attended the Indep. Co. HHI Coalition with 7 attending the CPPW Meeting.
- April 28<sup>th</sup>, Newark Elementary, Marilyn Cone distributed 3 Jungle Jive DVDs to Newark School District, they have 3 preschool classes in different locations; these DVD's will impact 95 preschool students.
- LHUA is still working with the Eagle Mountain School through the Coordinated School Health Program
- All Independence County Schools are providing after school activities at the GYM free to the community. Yoga, Zumba, Line dancing, etc.
- Plans are underway for the Safety Baby Shower are underway
- Independence County Adult County Survey has been completed for Community Putting Prevention to Work

### **Izard County—**

- April 4<sup>th</sup> LHU setup a display in lobby on Public Health Week. It focused on injury prevention with numerous handouts on safety along with poison control magnets and numbers. It addressed all specific areas in the five days. Each person coming into the unit was given a ticket for drawing for prizes related to safety such as night, lights, plug covers,

bathtub mats, etc. Others were given cups and pencils. Some prizes were provided through Bettye Watts and UAMS. The clerks and nurses educated people while explaining the drawing for prizes and the purpose of the event.

- April 12<sup>th</sup> the Izard County HHI Coalition hosted a Lawmakers' Dinner to educate and launch new program entitled, "Not in Our House", a drinking prevention campaign. All of the county city councilmen, mayors, judges and elected officials were invited. Approximately 120 people attended. The Youth Board presented a skit on alcohol prevention and problems youth face. A Youth Member gave a speech on underage drinking prevention. ACT 13 along with t-shirts & yard signs saying, "Not in Our House" were given to supporters attending.
- April 14<sup>th</sup> Treva Engelhardt, LHUA, visited the local food bank, Manna House, sharing info and guidelines on WIC and certification. They said they have requests for formula and will refer to LHU. Discussed as well the possibility of working with the Rice Depot to become diaper distributors for our clients and others in the county and referring people to LHU that might need Family Planning services & children needing immms.
- April 15<sup>th</sup> the Izard County HHI Coalition held a Lunch and Learn for the Izard County police enforcement including Horseshoe Bend City Police. This event provided up-to-date info on Clean Air Laws, ACT 13 and changes to it; and hosting laws and penalties. Speakers included Chris Haley, Tobacco Prevention Coordinator., and Linda Moser, Underage Drinking Prevention Coordinator. Attendance 25.
- April 16<sup>th</sup> the Izard County HHI held the Youth Scholarship fund-raising dodge ball game. Education information was given on prevention of underage drinking and tobacco use to all attendees of the event with over 15 teams registering to play to raise scholarship money for graduating seniors. A large attendance of 155 community participants played, watched, and supported scholarship funding.
- April 21<sup>st</sup>, Ozarka College and Izard Co HHI Coalition collaborated to host the Annual Ozarka Spring Carnival, representatives from law enforcement, judicial courts, and coordinators were available to discuss prevention of underage use of tobacco and alcohol; social host laws and consequences and get tobacco-free & alcohol-free pledges. SOS materials were distributed to the attendees along with other educational materials, including diabetes education. Attendance was over 650. Izard County HHI Coalition and Ozarka funded the event plus the staffed the booths. The National Guard and other community agencies also setup booths. Underage drinking grant funded live radio remote at the event. There were door prize drawings along with free hotdogs and drinks for attendees.
- April 27<sup>th</sup>, Nutrition presentation which included My Pyramid, WIC and DVD, Adventures of Zobey, Jungle Jive. The DVD is in English and Spanish and the participants were Pre-K teachers. Each school present received a My Pyramid Poster to be used in the classrooms and received nutrition pamphlets. The DVD's were distributed: midland School, 2 DVDs, #74 students; ICC, 1 DVD, #30 students; Melbourne School, 1 DVD, #35 students; Cave City School, 1 DVD, #60 students, Batesville School 3 DVDs #245 students. This presentation impacts 444 preschool students and 17 teachers.
- April 29<sup>th</sup>, Izard County Health Unit and our HHI Coalition had display booths at the Melbourne High School Health Day. Presented displays on tobacco and underage drinking prevention also diabetes education and nutrition. 5-Star diabetes program provided bottled water, apples, oranges and bananas as snacks for the kids. The HHI Coalition provided various freebies with SOS messages. Kids were able to talk to coordinators and sign pledges to be tobacco-free. LHU provided Family Planning info in packets given out at booths. HHI 5-Star Network also provided some free meters for Ozarks nursing students to do blood sugar testing & blood pressure for teachers, staff & any student requesting it.
- Izard County hosted site for Baxter Regional Hospital mammography van keeping appointment book when van is parked in LHU lot on days they schedule patients.
- Public Health Week showed car seat info and laws
- Contacted all three school nurses to try & setup T-dap clinics.
- Assisted Stone County with their Senior High Health Day on April 8<sup>th</sup>, Mt. View High School
- Using UAMS AHEC Medicine Assistance Program again
- Diabetes Group in Brockwell as averaged 8 to 10 people with most people bringing a family member or friend
- Provided educational materials and info at Ozarka Spring Carnival
- Continuing "Back to Sleep" Campaigns in LHU and working on teen family planning
- PHW display in unit, setup display in waiting area and focused on Injury Prevention with numerous handouts.
- Extension Office Display in lobby on serving sizes and nutritionist has info to handout from extension office when she talks with WIC clients, measuring spoons & measuring cups

#### **Lawrence County—**

- News Releases were shared with Black Rock, Imboden & Ravenden.
- CPR and First Aid Classes given to 3 preschool teachers and the dangers of smoking on the cardiovascular, all pasted post test. This was completed by CHNS, Karen Davis for Piggott School Employees

### **Mississippi County—**

- Mississippi County LHU-Blytheville is proud to announce one of their first enrollees in the pilot “Pregnancy Initiative Smoking Cessation Program” delivered a healthy infant boy, March 2<sup>nd</sup>. Jessica Buckingham enrolled in the program to pregnant women who smoke beginning in Sept. 2010 to help them to stop smoking. Over 40 clients have been offered the program since Sept. 2010 and they have enrolled a total of 16 clients. Only five of those have been successful, stopped smoking, returned for their follow-up appointments and remain in the program.
- The LHU participated in a Health Conference sponsored by Osceola Shalom at the Osceola High School. The focus of the conference was self-esteem, health issues, education and decision making. LHUA, Walter Holloway, and others from the LHU participated in this event. They provided counseling, education and issued educational materials on STDs, Women’s Health, Nutrition, Exercise, Obesity, Abstinence, Smoking, and Pregnancy and provided an overview of the services offered by the LHU. Approximately 325 students in grades 9-12 attended the conference. Michelle Williams, PHI, served as an expert panelist and discussed STDs and the importance of making the right choices.
- April 5<sup>th</sup> First Missionary Baptist, 15 attendees, PHE, Kim McCray present heart health information to the Walk Away the Pounds group after one of their weekly walks.
- April 20<sup>th</sup> LHUA did an oral presentation for the Miss. Co. Inter-Agency Council, at the Grecian Restaurant. Group is comprised of leaders from many civic, governmental, non-profit and private industry organizations. The group focuses on identifying and finding solutions to issues that affect our community. He discussed the county and state health rankings and the role of the LHU as a community partner.
- April 26<sup>th</sup>, LHUA met with a planning group with the Mississippi County Economic Opportunity Commission to discuss their grant application for a Home Visiting Program for pregnant females and children up to 5 years of age. Social Workers or paraprofessionals would be conducting the visits. The visits would be aimed at providing counseling and assisting the families in accessing resources in the community that support a healthy lifestyle for mother and child.

### **Poinsett County—**

- The Delta Garden Study has announced three of its four full-scale study schools. Harrisburg Middle School in Poinsett County and Highland Middle School in Sharp County are two and will all be participating in the Delta Garden Study’s first year of its full-scale study, set to begin in fall 2011. The schools will kick-off their gardens with spring ground-breaking ceremonies and will then receive full-time Garden Program Specialists in early June who will maintain the garden and assist in the implementation of the DGS curriculum.

### **Randolph County—**

- April 18<sup>th</sup> CHNS, Karen Davis, presented a program on the dangers of smoking to 7<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup> graders in the classroom at Pocahontas Junior High. Info given on Quit-line, pre- and post-test questions answers proved students understood the educational information, 60 attendees.

### **Sharp County—**

LHUA, Matt Burks, 5 Star Diabetic Network Coordinator and Amanda Harvey, AHEC to present presentations at the Highland Schools CSH meeting. - Marilyn Cone has been working with Millie Collins and Renee Brink on Nutrition Presentation for the Cave City School & providing tobacco presentation to Cave City 5<sup>th</sup> graders.
