DISCIPLINARY HEARINGS

General Counsel, David Dawson represented the Board. Motions reflect the decisions of the Board reached in deliberation following the hearing of each case.

REGINALD A. BURTON, LPN LICENSE NO. L048287

Respondent was present for the proceedings before the Board and was not represented by counsel. Lisa Wooten, MPH, BSN, RN., Mary Trentham, Attorney Specialist, and Kathy Barnhill, Coordinator, Courtyard Gardens Health and Rehabilitation Center, Arkadelphia, AR, provided testimony on behalf of the Board. Larry Hatchet, LPN, Shantell Mitchell, and Marcia Moore, Director of Nursing, Hickory Heights, testified on behalf of the Respondent. Respondent has been charged with a violation of Ark. Code Ann. § 17-87-309(a)(6) and (a)(7) and pleads not guilty to the charges. Respondent is licensed as a Licensed Practical Nurse and holds License No. L048287. On or about January 10, 2019, Arkansas State Board of Nursing received a letter from Kathy Barnhill, Administrator at North Little Rock Healthcare & Rehab. Ms. Barnhill reported Respondent was terminated on or about December 21, 2018, for a "verbal altercation with a certified nursing assistant that included loud cursing, in a hallway that prevented timely care of residents." It was also reported that Respondent used verbal and emotional abuse towards multiple residents. A resident reported Respondent and aid were arguing loudly in the hall, her call light was not answered timely, and her needs were not taken care of. The resident stated that Respondent "called her Ms. Rockerfella and was rude to her." Resident also stated that Respondent has "cursed at her on several occasions and is very mean." A resident reported Respondent "hollered at him when he came into the room and found [resident] on the floor." The resident stated Respondent laughed at him and left him in urine instead of helping him up. The resident stated he felt "belittled and shamed." The resident also stated that Respondent told him to get off the phone while the resident was talking to his wife. Resident's wife stated that she heard Respondent scold her husband for talking to her and heard Respondent "in a hateful, rude way, tell [resident] to get off the phone." A resident reported Respondent was "very sarcastic when delivering medications. The way [Respondent] addressed her and his mannerism was not nice." The resident stated that Respondent would administer over the counter sleep aides when she was taking prescription medications and [Respondent] stated [to the resident] no one stays awake on [his] A resident assigned to Respondent stated that it took "over two (2) hours [for Respondent] to get pain medication to him." Resident never did get medication from Respondent. Per the resident, Respondent came to the room and stated, "I have been dealing with a dead body." The resident then

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stated Respondent "put his hand in my face and told him the next nurse would give him his medication." A resident reported Respondent accused him of "playing with his colostomy bag." The resident stated that Respondent told him "he would make him pay for playing with his bag and left him in his chair for thirty minutes with BM running down his leg and chair." Respondent has prior discipline with the Board. He received a Letter of Reprimand dated November 25, 2008, issued at the time of initial licensure for a prior criminal conviction. George M. DeRoeck, Psy.D., evaluated Respondent. Respondent was offered a Consent Agreement. Respondent declined the Consent Agreement and requested a hearing.

MOTION: I MOVE that based on the evidence presented and the allegations contained in the Order and Notice of Hearing, the Arkansas State Board of Nursing finds that **REGINALD A. BURTON, LPN LICENSE NO. L048287,** has been charged with a violation of Ark. Code Ann. § 17-87-309(a)(6) and (a)(7) and that Respondent's license and privilege to practice as a nurse be suspended six (6) months, to be followed by probation for two years, with the following terms and conditions:

- Pursuant to A.C.A. §17-87-104(b)(1), Respondent must pay a civil penalty of \$1,8750.00 plus any outstanding balance associated with previous disciplinary action. Such fine shall be payable within fifteen (15) days of receipt of this order. If unable to pay the civil penalty within fifteen (15) days, a payment schedule shall be submitted within fifteen (15) days to the Arkansas State Board of Nursing, via the Arkansas Nurse Portal.
- Respondent shall provide evidence to the Board of a comprehensive neuropsychological evaluation within thirty (30) days of receipt of this order. Acceptable evidence shall consist of an in-depth psychological evaluation with appropriate testing from a psychiatrist. The evaluation shall contain evidence that the evaluator knows the reason for the referral. The evaluator shall specifically advise the Board that the nurse is or is not presently able to engage in the safe practice of nursing or recommend the conditions, if any, under which safe practice could occur. Respondent shall ensure the evaluator sends the report directly to the Board.
- Based on the neuropsychological evaluation, Respondent shall obtain or continue counseling
 with a psychiatrist, psychologist, or other recognized mental health practitioner and shall
 submit the practitioner's progress report quarterly until discharged by the practitioner.
 Respondent shall log all appointments via the Board approved monitoring program.
 Treatment shall begin within thirty (30) days of receipt of this order.
- Respondent shall provide evidence within six months of successful completion of the Board approved course(s): Nurse and Professional Behaviors, Anger Man, Elder Care, and Stress Management. Respondent shall submit the certificate(s) of completion via the Board approved monitoring program.
- Respondent shall submit the Enforcement Personal Report to the Board via the Board approved monitoring program quarterly.
- Respondent shall execute any release necessary to give the Board access to records, including but not limited to medical, psychological, employment, and or criminal records.
 Failure to execute a release shall be grounds for additional disciplinary action against Respondent's license / privilege to practice.
- Respondent shall ensure that all reports, of Respondent and the employer, are submitted quarterly.
- Respondent shall obey all federal, state, and local laws, and all rules governing the practice
 of nursing in this state.
- Respondent shall be responsible for all costs involved in complying with the Board's order.
- Respondent shall request license reinstatement to the Board via the Arkansas Nurse Portal once compliance with the Board's suspension order is met.
- A probation period of two years shall follow the suspension period. All conditions of the suspension period shall continue through the probation period.
- While on probation, if working as a nurse, The Nurse Licensure Compact status of Respondent's Arkansas license shall be single state, allowing practice only in the state of

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Arkansas. Respondent may submit the *Multistate Nursing License Application* after successful completion of probation to determine if license qualifies for multi-state compact status. Respondent shall notify and present to each employer a copy of this Board order. Respondent shall have employer sign and submit directly to the Board the document, *Employer Acknowledgement*. Respondent shall have their employer submit directly to the Board a *Performance Evaluation Report* quarterly. Respondent shall not collect any drug screen from aparticpant whom has been ordered to drug screen by the Board of Nursing.

- Respondent shall work under supervision in any setting. Supervision requires another nurse
 at the same or higher education level, to be working in the same setting as Respondent and
 be readily available to provide assistance and intervention.
- Respondent shall not be employed in critical care, in-home hospice or home health settings.
- Respondent shall notify the Board within ten (10) days, via the Arkansas Nurse Portal, of any change, even a temporary one, in name, address, or employer.
- Respondent shall request verification of termination of the probationary period via the Arkansas Nurse Portal.
- Pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §17-87-309, failure to comply with this order may result in additional disciplinary action on the Respondent's licensure and/or privilege, including but not limited to, additional probation, suspension, or revocation of licensure and/or privilege to practice nursing in this state.
- During the period of probation, Respondent may work in Long Term Care, 7am-9pm, weekdays only; not to exceed 40 hours/week.
