I. Call to order:

Dr. Henry-Tillman, co-chair, called the meeting to order at 5:08 pm.

II. Review and approval of meeting minutes from August 24, 2022, quarterly meeting.

Dr. Fant made a motion to approve the minutes and Sharon Parrett seconded, which was approved on a voice vote. Sharon Parrett made a motion to approve the minutes from the Special Breast Cancer Control Advisory meeting on August 29, 2022, and Dr. Jerri Fant seconded. The motion was approved on voice vote.

III. Reports

A. BreastCare Non-Federal Revenues and Expenditures July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023

Michael Koch was unavailable to review reports. Full reports are provided in the meeting packet.

B. FY2023 First Quarter Enrollment Report

Brandi Sutphin, Epidemiology Supervisor, presented the first quarter enrollment report. Ms. Sutphin reported that the numbers are about the same as last year. Sutphin reported 2,728 women enrolled in BreastCare which is 100 more than last year. There were 3,256 screenings performed in the first three months of this fiscal year. The numbers are not much different than last year first quarter FY22. Ms. Sutphin said, breast cancers and In Situ breast cancer numbers are overall about the same as last quarter. There were a few less cervical precancers, one more breast cancer, and one more cervical cancer. Ms. Sutphin said, we expect about the same amount of money from the state tax and expect to spend a little bit more with federal funds and are hoping to serve about 500 more women this year than last year. Ms. Sutphin reported 10,635 women enrolled last year, 9,339 women served, and 8,932 women were screened.

C. Contracts

Dr. Hattie Scribner, BreastCare Administrator, presented the first quarter contract report for FY22. Dr. Scribner reported that St. Francis Community Clinic serves a total of 12 clinics. Only five clinics were included on the

report. St. Francis Community Clinic had a total of 902 eligible women for this quarter 24 of them were mammogram referrals, 535 of them received multiple services. Dr. Scribner reported the number of women that were navigated, 29 were screened, five with diagnostics and none that had treatment. Dr. Scribner reported that Arkansas Foundation for Medical Care for the beginning of the year they began at 46.8% and at the end of the year 45.4% for breast cancer screening rates and cervical cancer screening rates began at 53.8% and ending at 53.2%. Dr. Scribner reported St. Bernard's mobile mammography for quarter one they cover the Northeast part of Arkansas. They served a total of 6 counties for this quarter with a total of 26 events, 438 referrals and out of the 438 referrals 265 were screened, one diagnostic and 10 women were enrolled into the BreastCare program with no breast cancer diagnosis for this quarter. Dr. Scribner reported UAMS mobile mammography for quarter one they served a total of seven different counties, along with 31 events total, with 4 diagnostics. Dr. Scribner said, 68 women were enrolled into the BreastCare program, and they had two breast cancer diagnosis.

D. FY2023 First Quarter Social Media Outreach Report

Rachel Johnson, Program Nurse Coordinator, presented the 1st quarter social media report from July 2022-September 2022. Ms. Johnson reported that program nurses continue to promote daily Mammo Van events on our Breast Care Facebook page. Ms. Mirivel, Director of Communications, reported that breast/cervical and other cancer related posts are posted regularly on the main ADH Facebook page and ADH Twitter page. Ms. Mirivel said the post on October 3, about pap smears we had an enormous amount of reach and impressions, and it was the post with most interaction on the Facebook page and twitter.

E. Discussion

Dr. Ronda Henry-Tillman inquired if patients could enroll in BreastCare without a home address. Reginald Rogers, ADH attorney, said that local health units do not deny services to patients without addresses. Sharon Parrett inquired about how do we serve women in homeless camps? Dr. Hattie replied that the program serve homeless women by partnering with organizations that serve the homeless population.

IV. Closing

Dr. Jeri Fant made the motion to adjourn, and Sharon Parrett seconded with no opposition, the meeting adjourned at 6:21pm.
