- among the first states to regulate e-cigarettes packaging and licensing
- to require smoke-free psychiatric facility grounds

- 79% of those policies included electronic smoking device definitions and coverage. One ofthemostsignificantwastheFort Smith Airport banning the use of e-cigarettes in its facilities.
- The Arkansas Tobacco Quitline expanded services to include supportivetextsandemailsalong withonlineandmobilecounseling servicesandcombinationnicotine replacement therapy.
- Collaborated with UAMS to provide a one-day CME course on tobacco prevention and cessation interventions at the 37th Annual Family Medicine Intensive Review Course. More than 200 physicians, nurses, physicians assistants and pharmacists participated in the course.
