PREFACE

This report is based on information obtained by licensing boards during the 2010 license renewal process. Copies of practitioner responses to questions on license renewal applications were provided to the Health Statistics Branch by the licensing boards. It should be noted that, because the data were collected by several boards on questionnaires designed to meet the licensing requirements of the individual professions, a certain consistency of format and content, desirable for manpower measurement, is missing from the data. Various items of demographic data, e.g., ethnic origin and gender, are obtained by some, but not all, of the boards. Information relating to a practitioner's location- address, city, county, state, etc.- meets the licensing board's need to communicate with the practitioner by mail and may or may not identify the site(s) where health related services are actually performed.

The report includes tables, maps and graphs representing health professions manpower distribution and demographics in Arkansas counties. The 2010 Census from the U.S. Census Bureau, Population Division, was used in the computation of population ratios throughout this report.

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Acknowledgement: We wish to express our gratitude to the licensing boards of these professions for their cooperation in providing requested access to their license-renewal files.

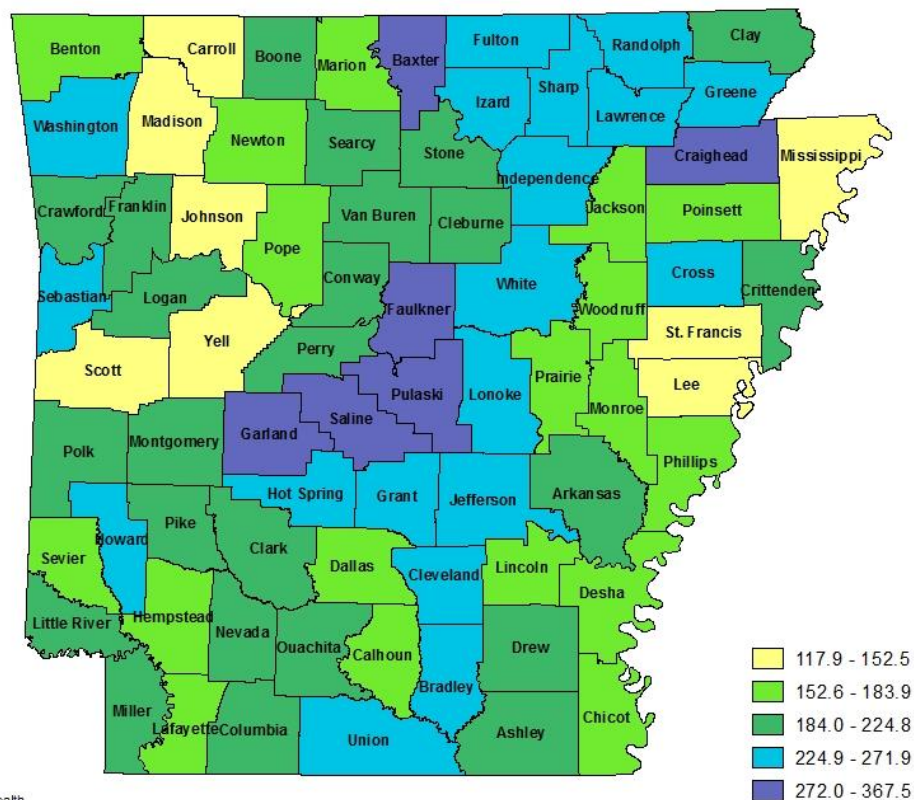
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Health Professionals in Arkansas

In 2010, there were 71,650 licensed health professionals with Arkansas mailing addresses serving 2.91 million Arkansans, a population ratio of 245 professionals for every 10,000 population living in the State. There were 17 professions administered by 11 boards. The largest registration was by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing, with 45,285 licensees, followed by the Arkansas Medical Board with 8,913 licensees. The smallest registration was by the Arkansas State Board of Optometry with 389 licensees. As a group, health professionals were distributed fairly evenly across the counties with a heavier concentration in counties with large population.

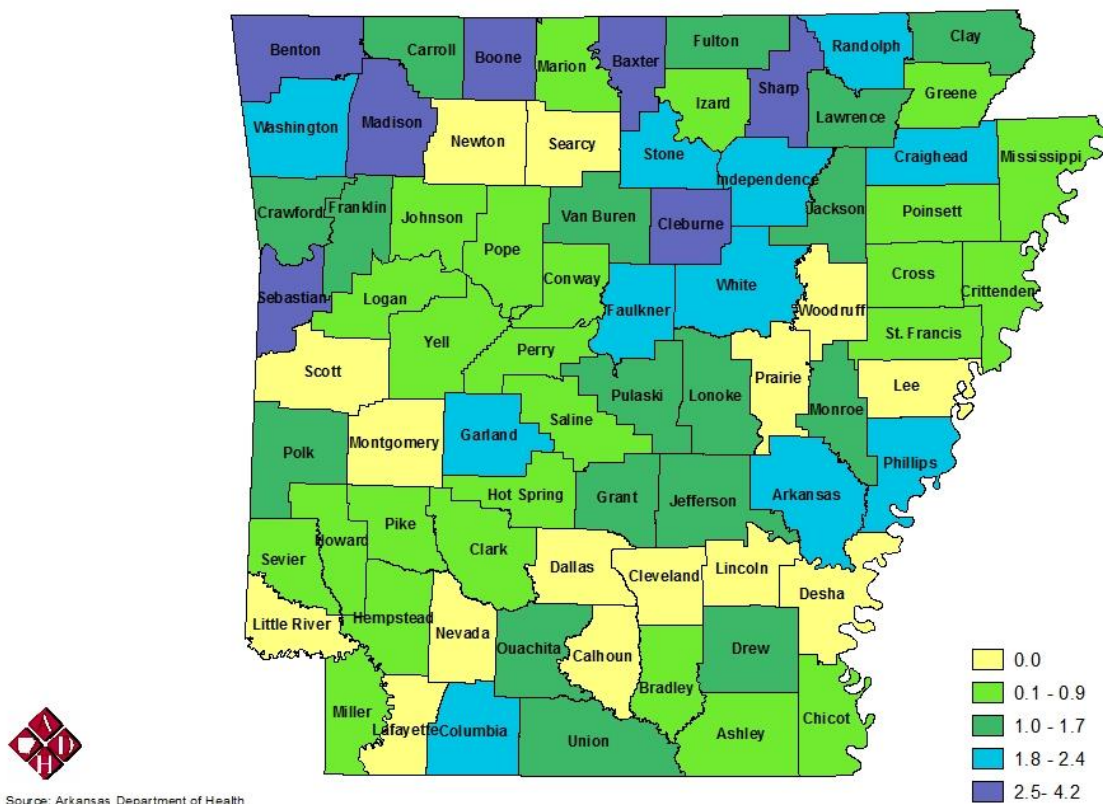

Chiropractors in Arkansas

In 2010, the Board of Chiropractic Examiners licensed 480 chiropractors with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 1.7 per 10,000 population. Of the 75 counties in Arkansas, 15 counties (20%) had no registered chiropractors and 13 other counties (17%) had only one.

Chiropractors by Counties Per 10,000 Population

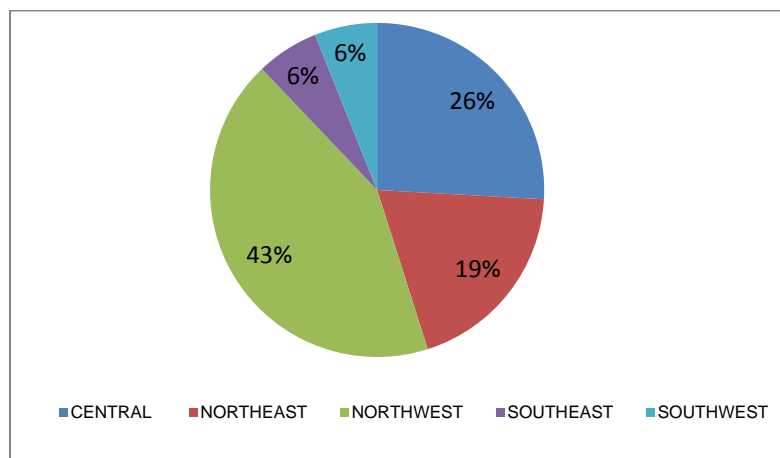

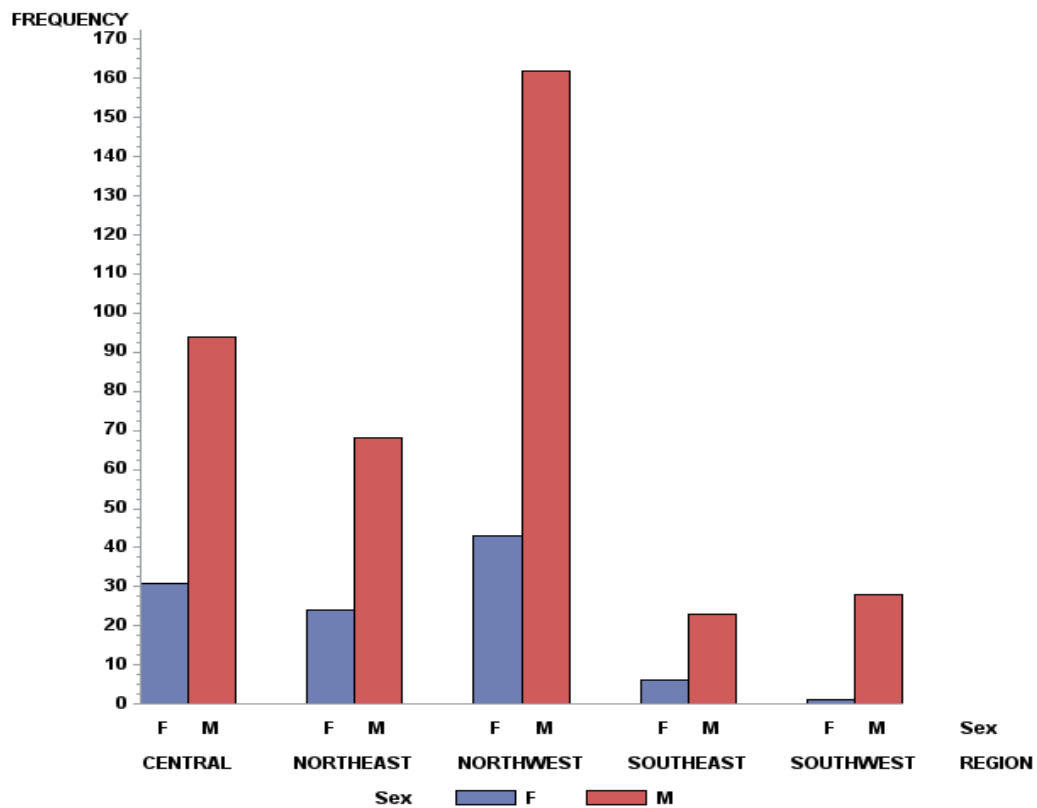

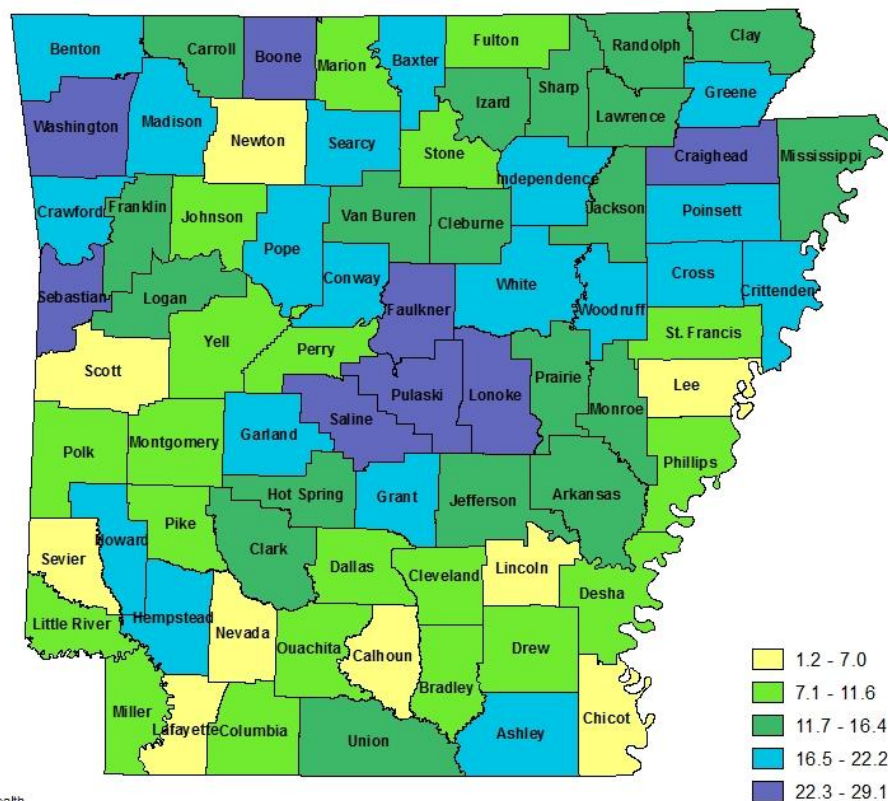

Dental Health Providers in Arkansas

In 2010, the Board of Dental Examiners licensed 5,557 providers of dental health services with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 18.8 per 10,000 populations. This total includes 1,181 dentists (D), 3,095 dental assistants (DA), and 1,281 dental hygienists (DH). Each of the 75 counties in Arkansas had at least one registered dental health provider.

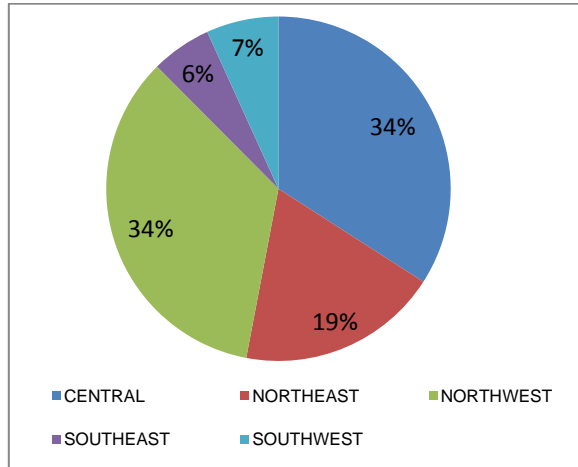
Dental Health Providers by Counties Per 10,000 Population



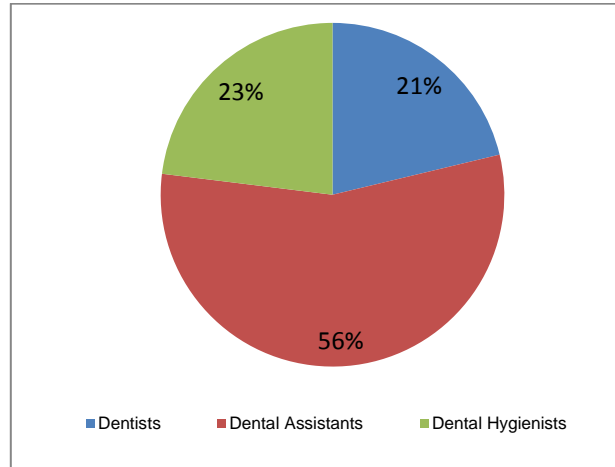

Distribution of Dental Providers by Specialist

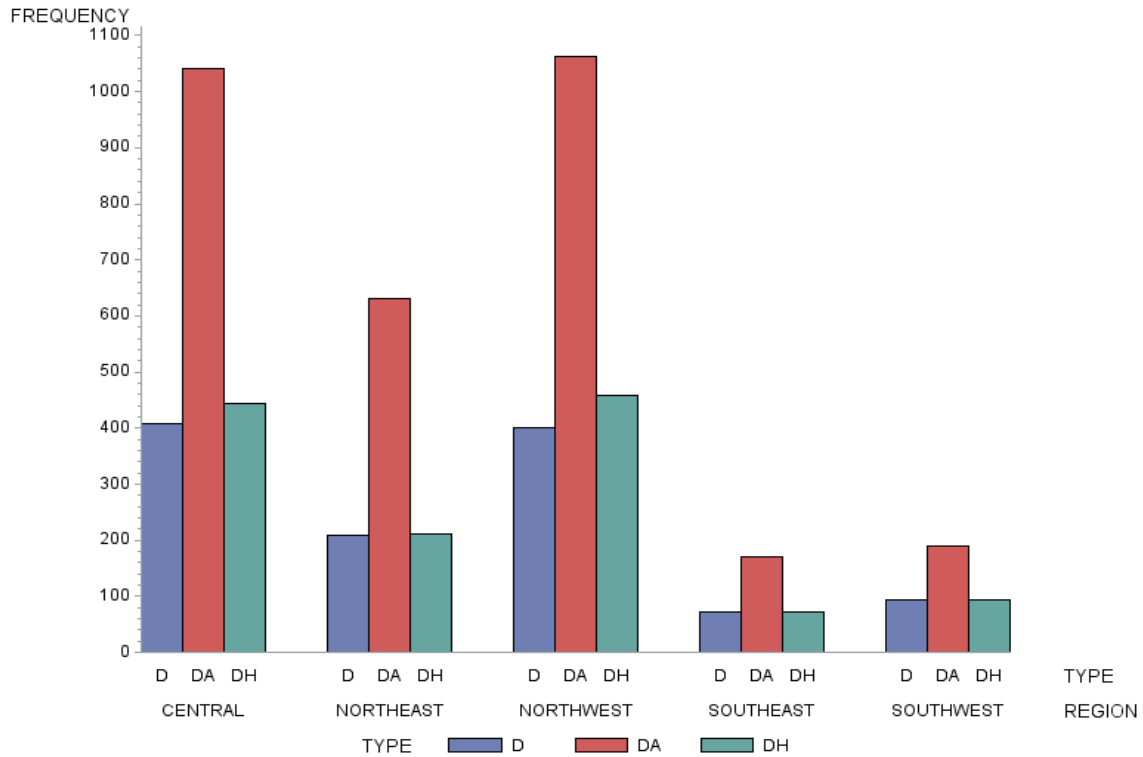

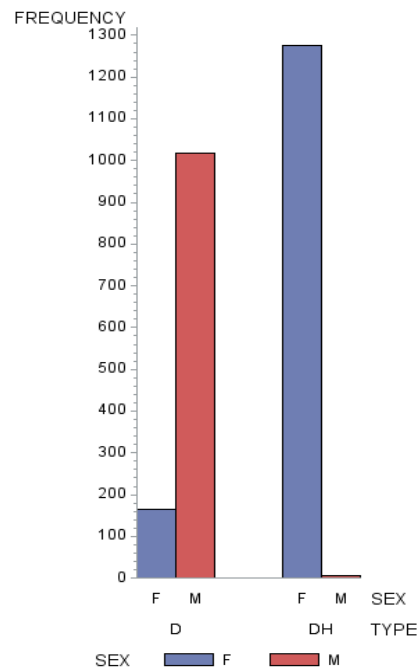

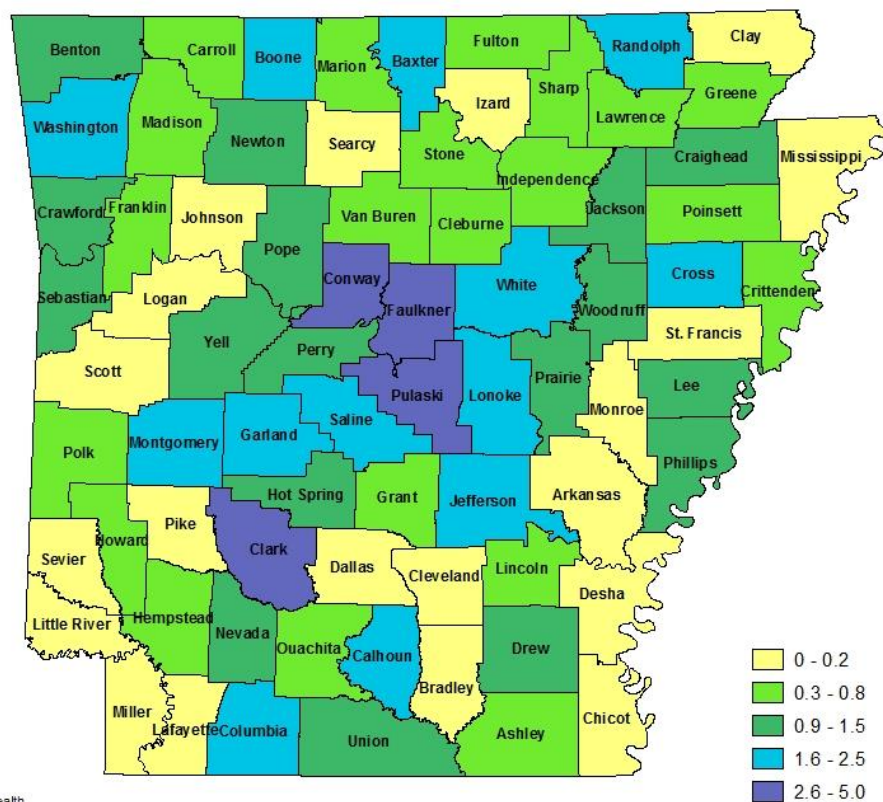

Dietitians by Counties Per 10,000 Population

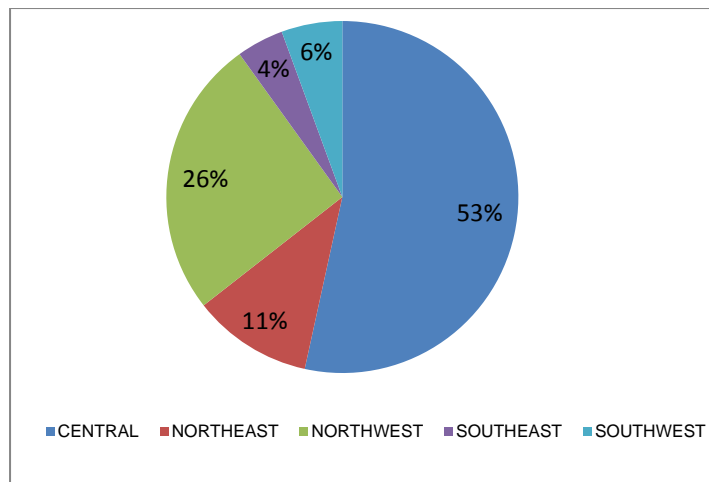

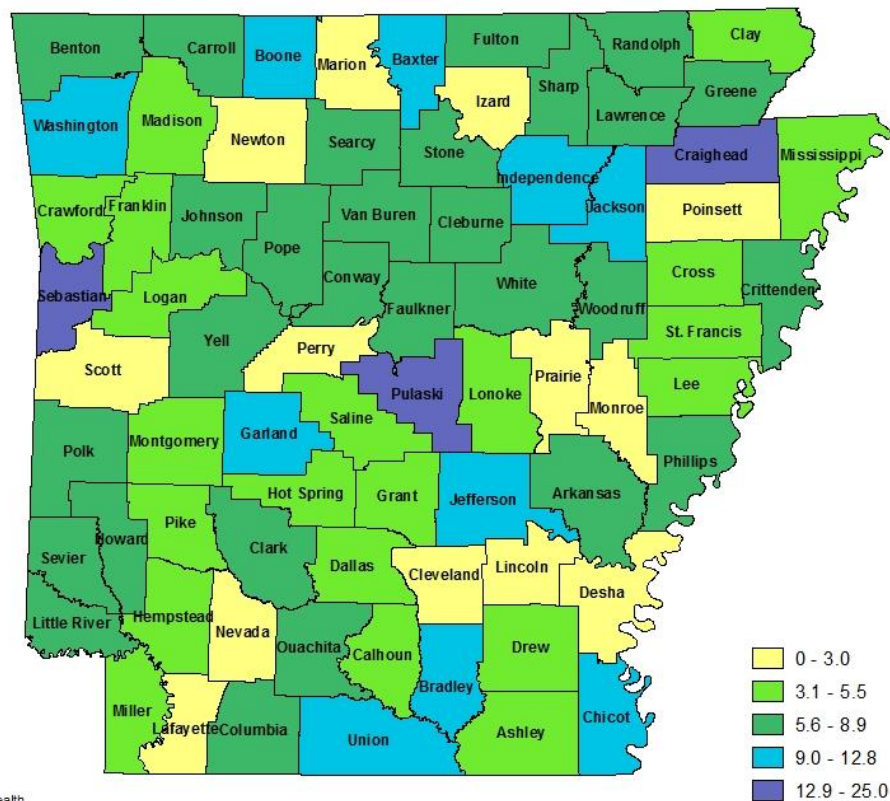

Medical (Doctors) in Arkansas

In 2010, the Medical Board licensed 8,913 physicians with mailing addresses in Arkansas. The 2010 registry includes 3,055 physicians (34%) registered in five primary care specialties with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 10.5 per 10,000 population. This list includes: 1,290 family practice, 116 general practice, 877 internal medicine, 290 obstetrics-gynecologists, and 482 pediatricians. At least one fully licensed primary care specialist was registered in each Arkansas county with the exception of Cleveland County. The board licensed 3,058 physicians (35%) registered as Health Related Professions, this total includes 1,664 Respiratory Therapists (LRCP), 1,015 Occupational Therapy (OT), 214 Occupational Therapy Assistants (OT-A), 160 Physician Assistants (PA), 1 Radiology (RA) and 4 Radiology Assistants (RPA). The board licensed 2,710 physicians (30%) as secondary specialists and 90 physicians (1%) who reported no specialty.

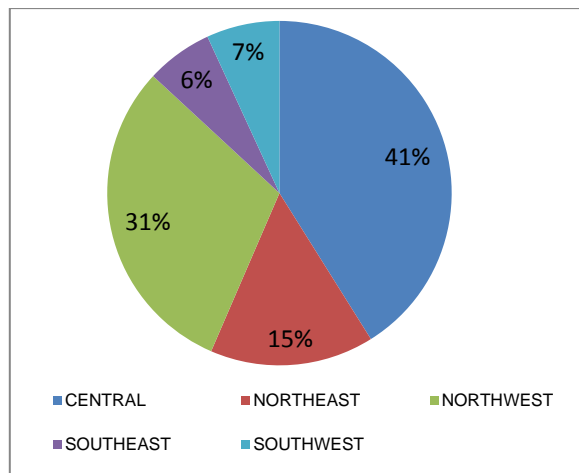
Primary Care Physicians by Counties Per 10,000 Population



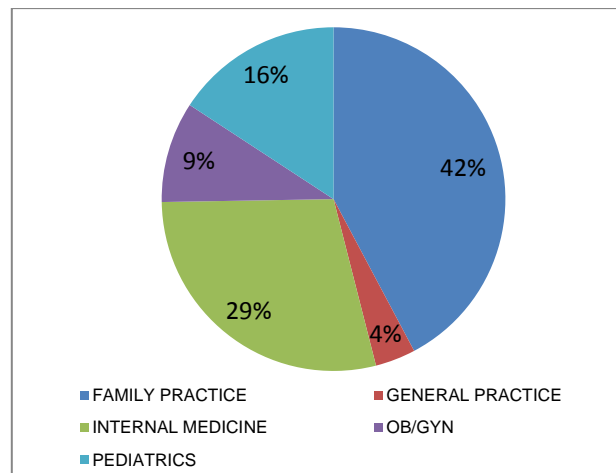

Distribution of Primary Care Physicians by Specialty

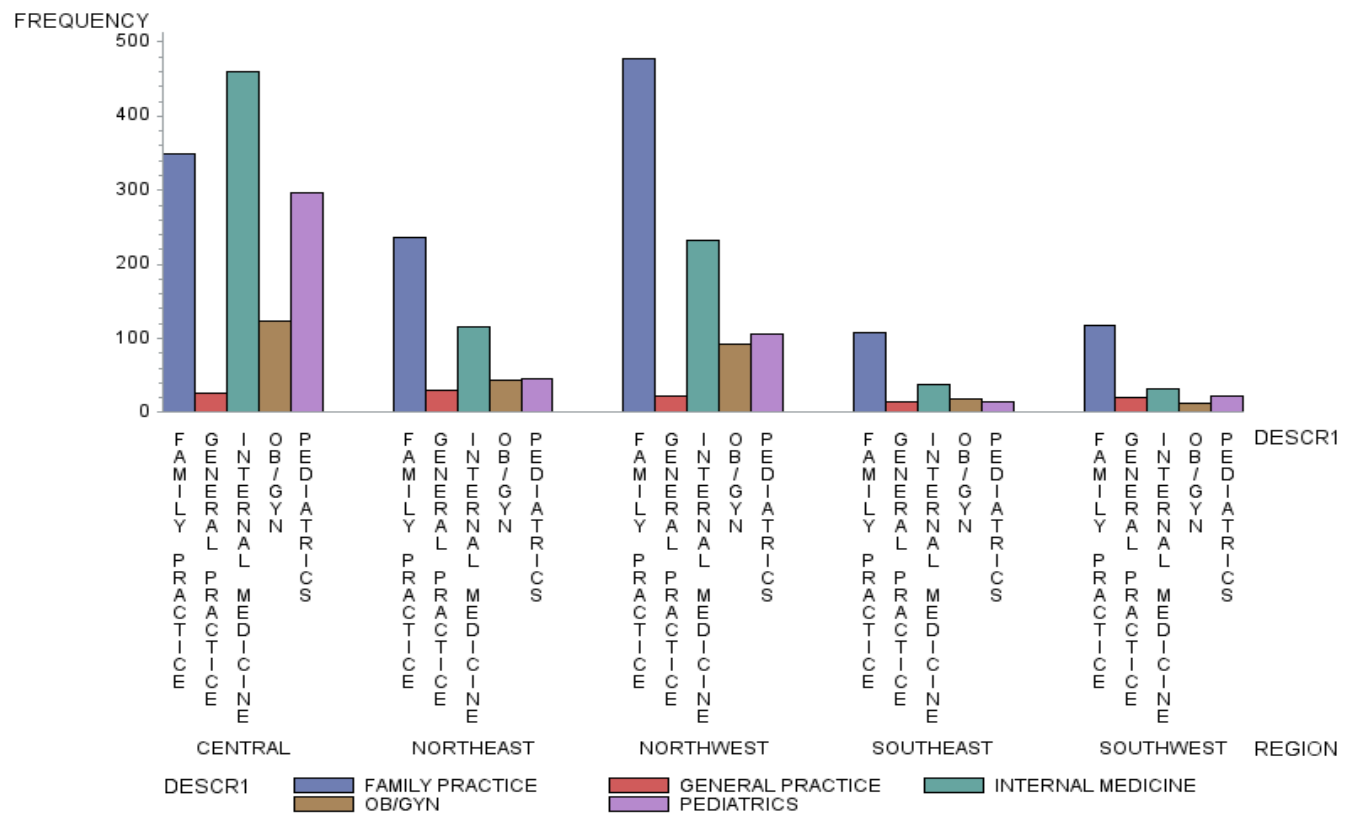

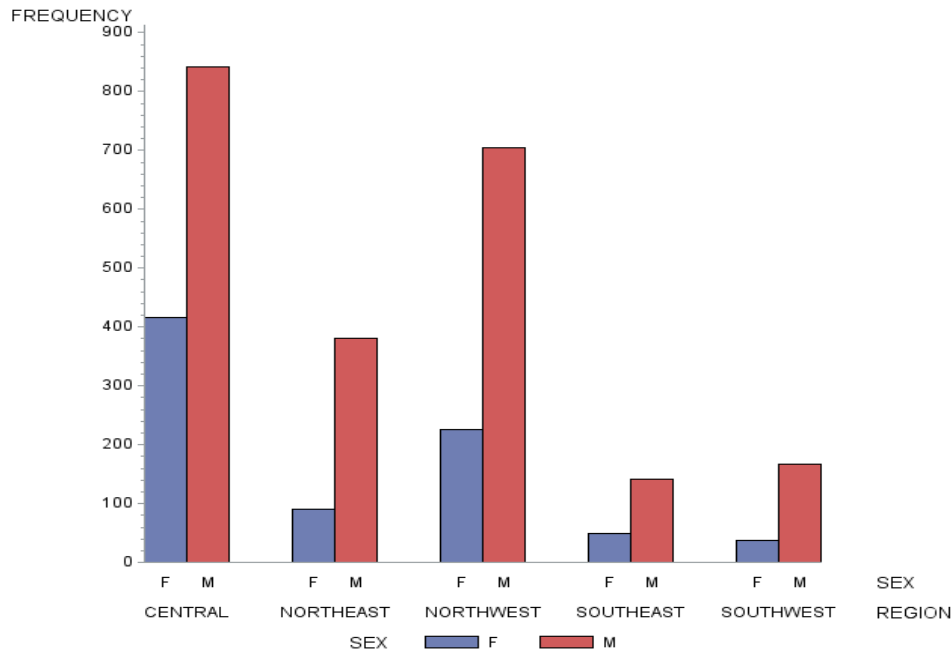

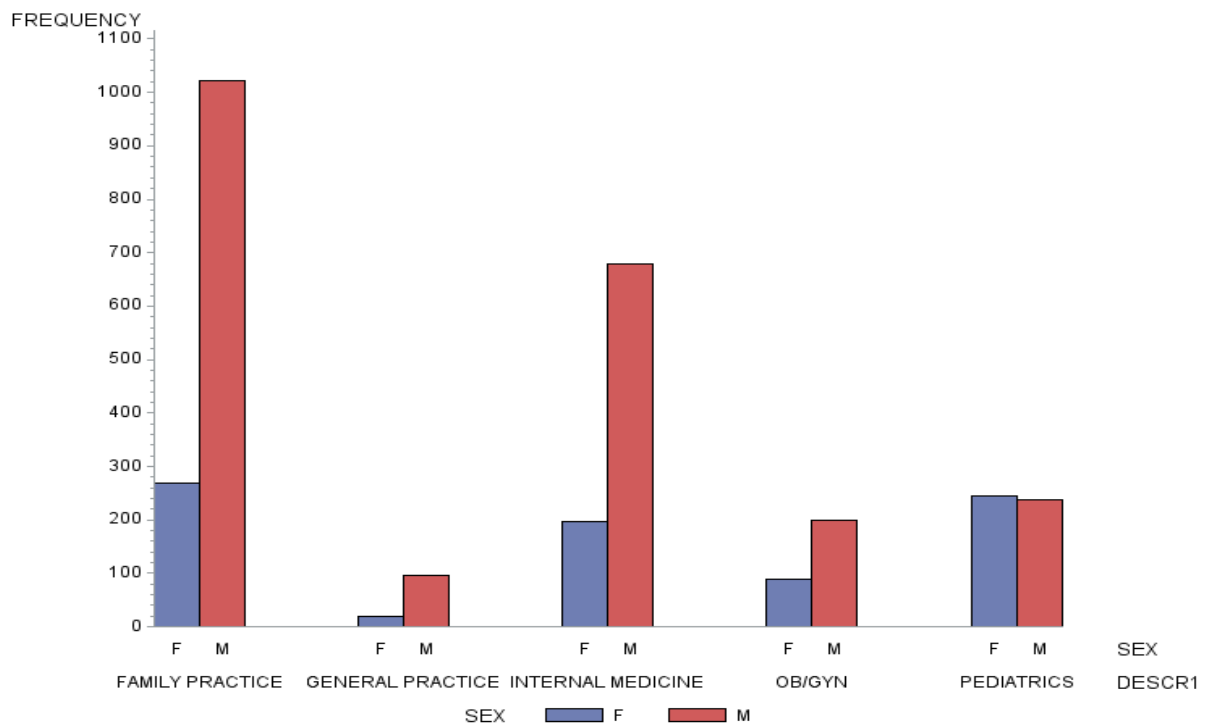
Primary Care Physicians by Regions and Specialty



The gender distribution of licensed primary care physicians is heavily skewed toward males (73%), with only (27%) of licensed primary care physicians being females.



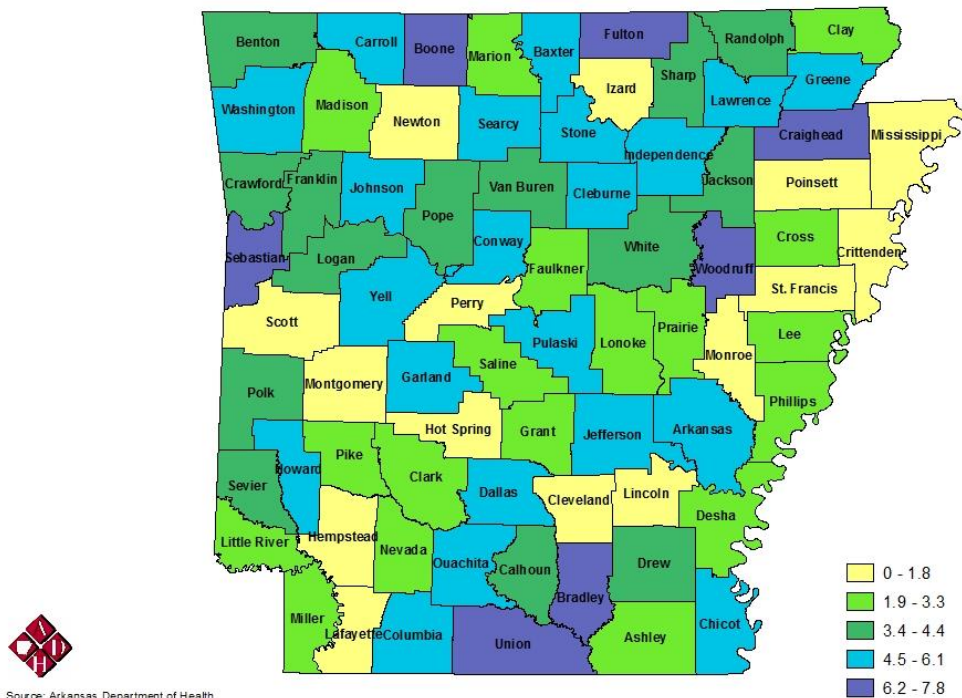
The next graph displays gender demographics among primary care physicians by specialty. The data indicate that, with the exception of pediatricians, primary care physicians are disproportionately male.



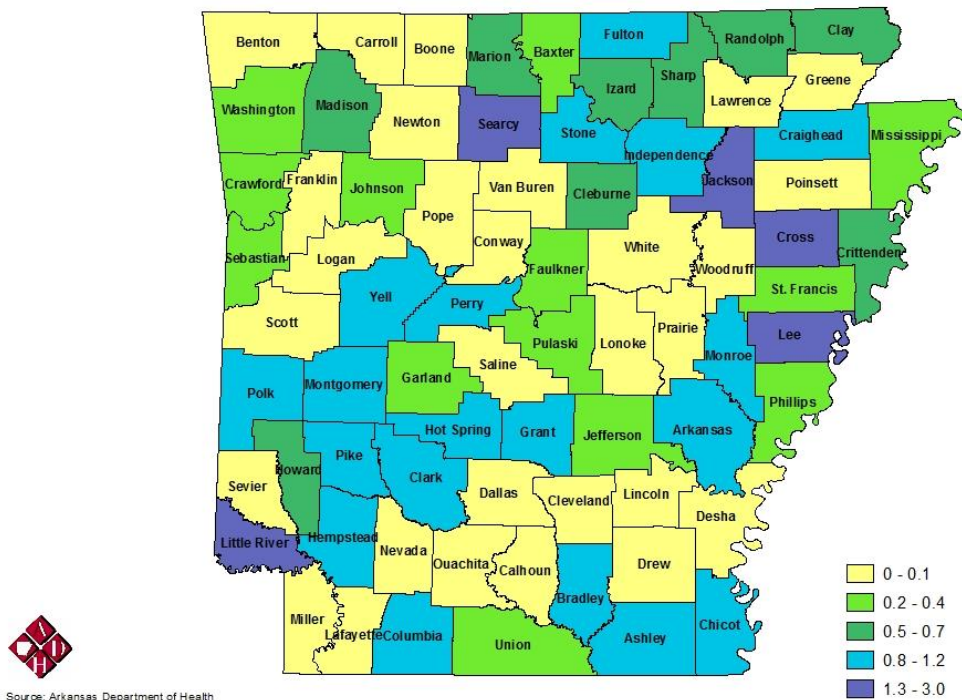

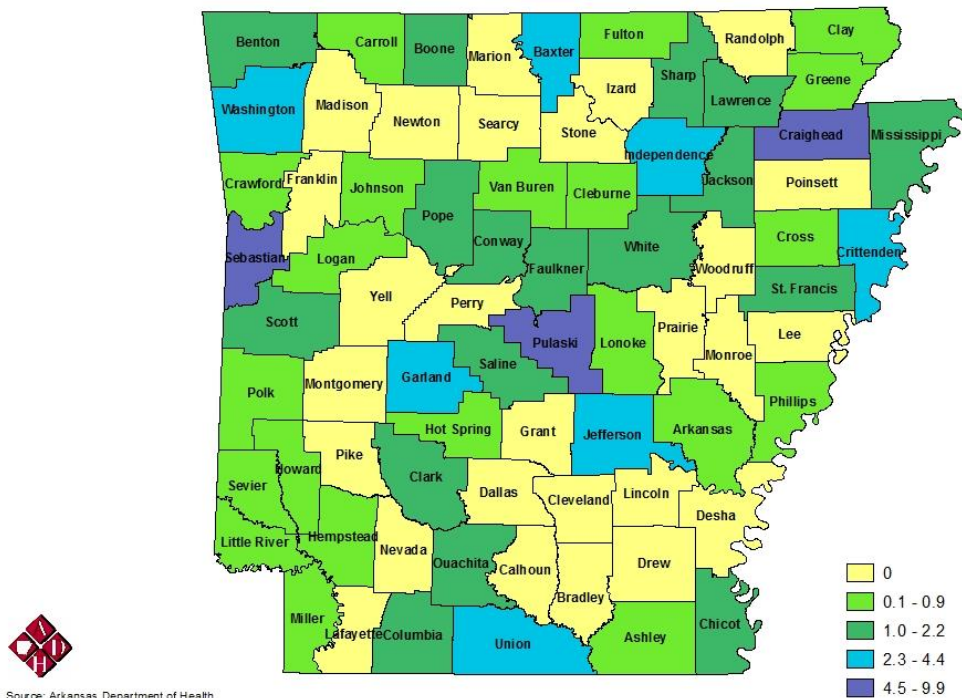
Family Practice Physicians by Counties Per 10,000 Population



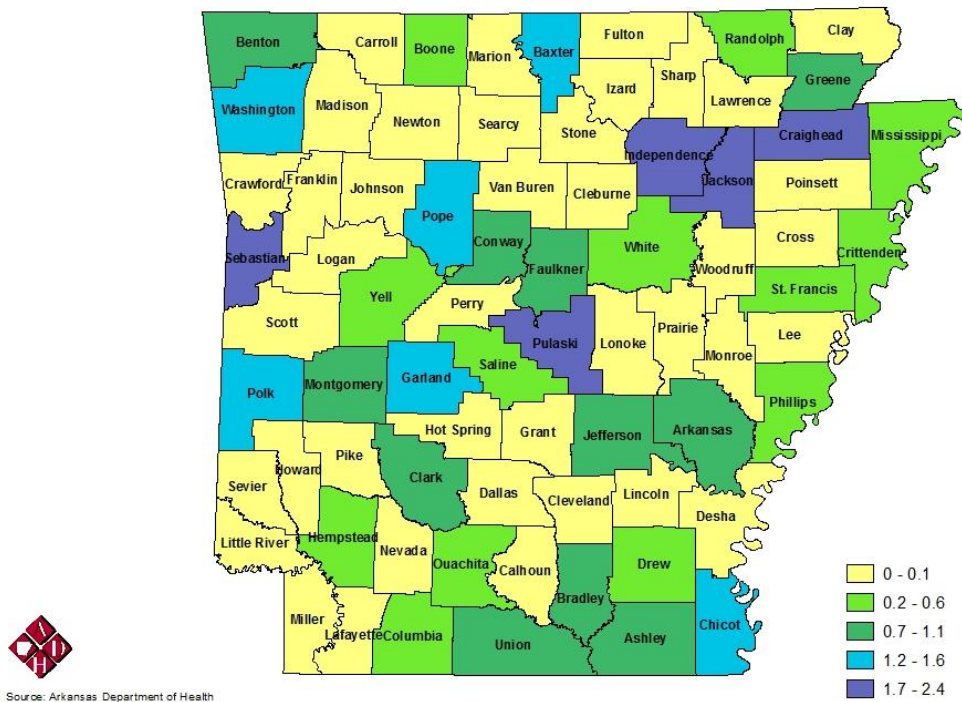
General Practice Physicians by Counties Per 10,000 Population



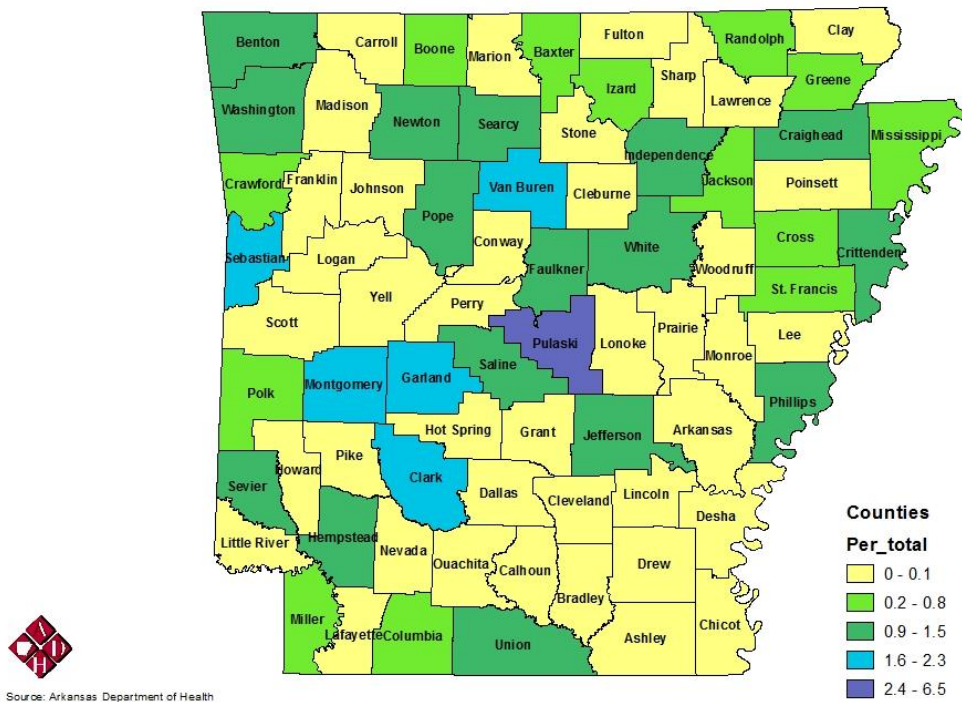
Internal Medicine Physicians by Counties Per 10,000 Population

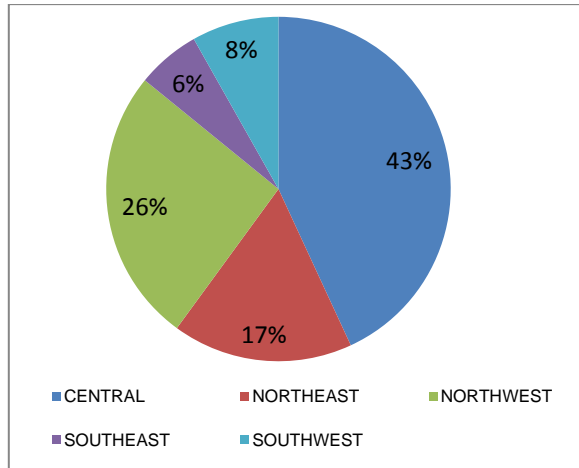

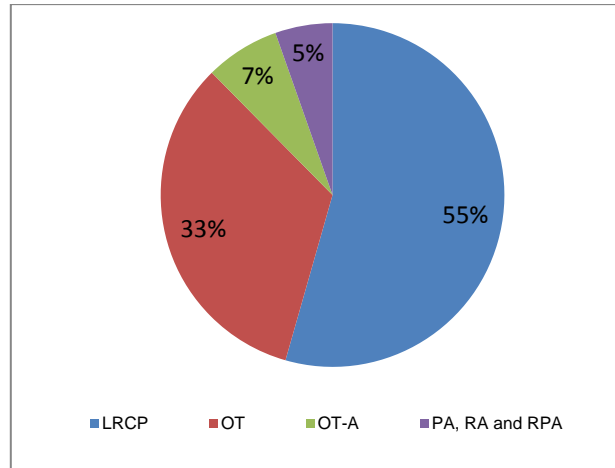

Distribution of Health Related Professions by Region



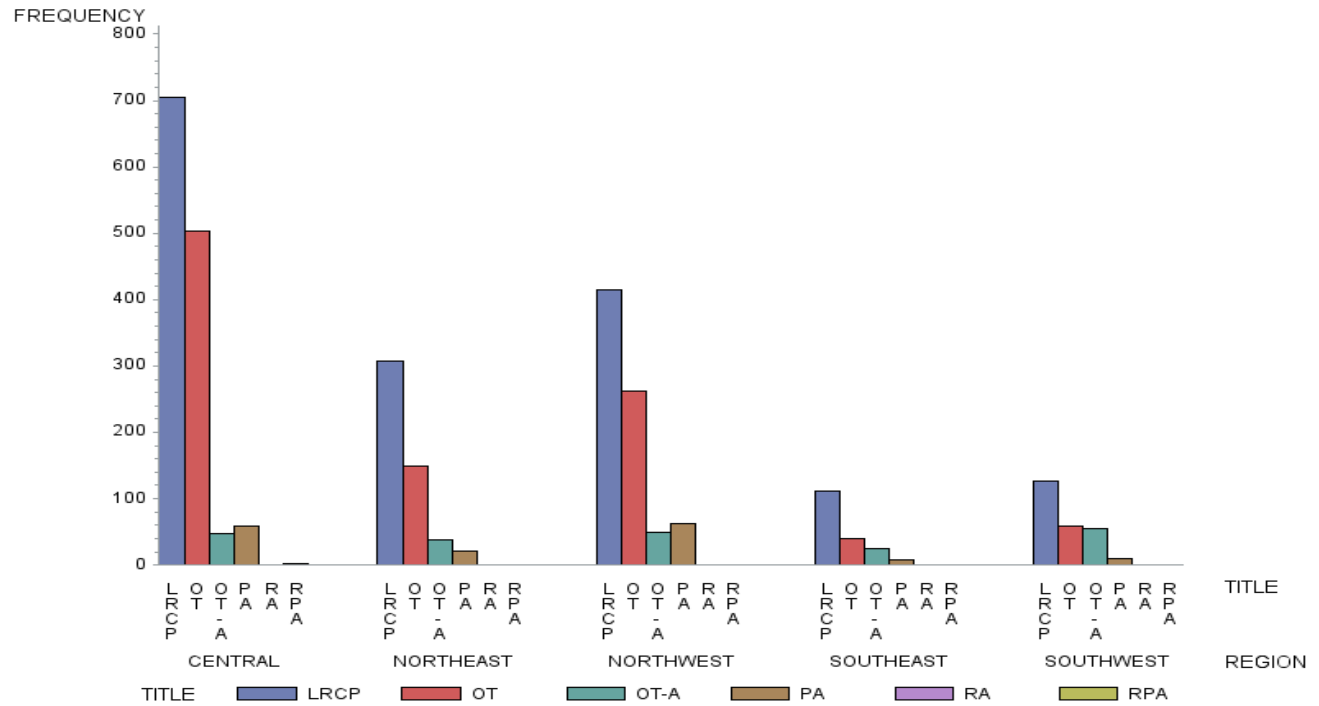
Distribution of Health Related Professions by Specialty



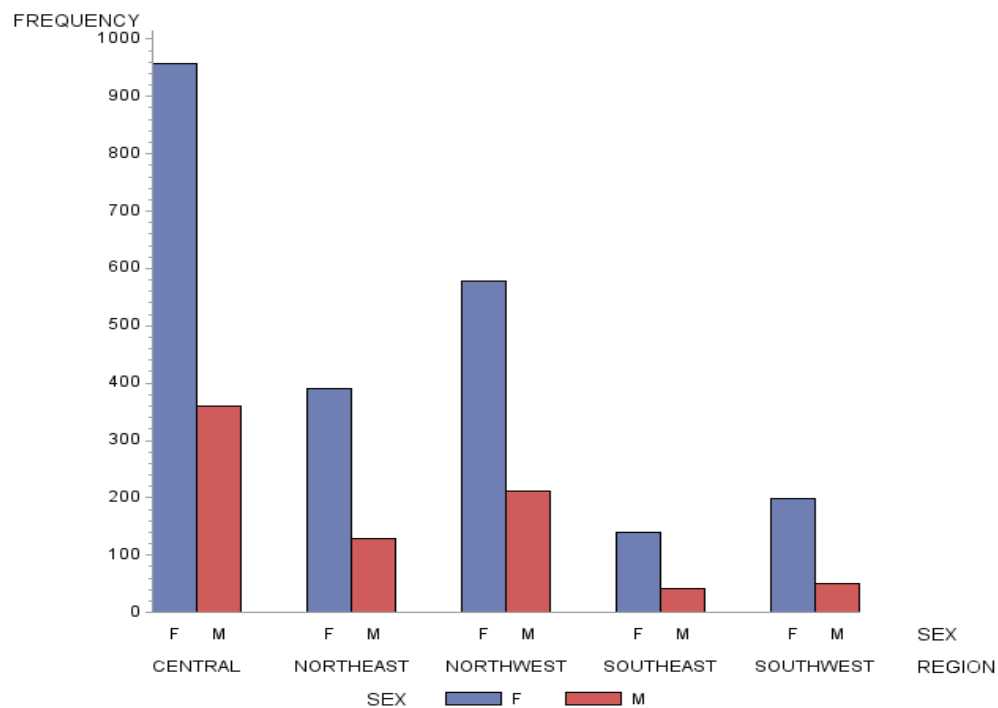

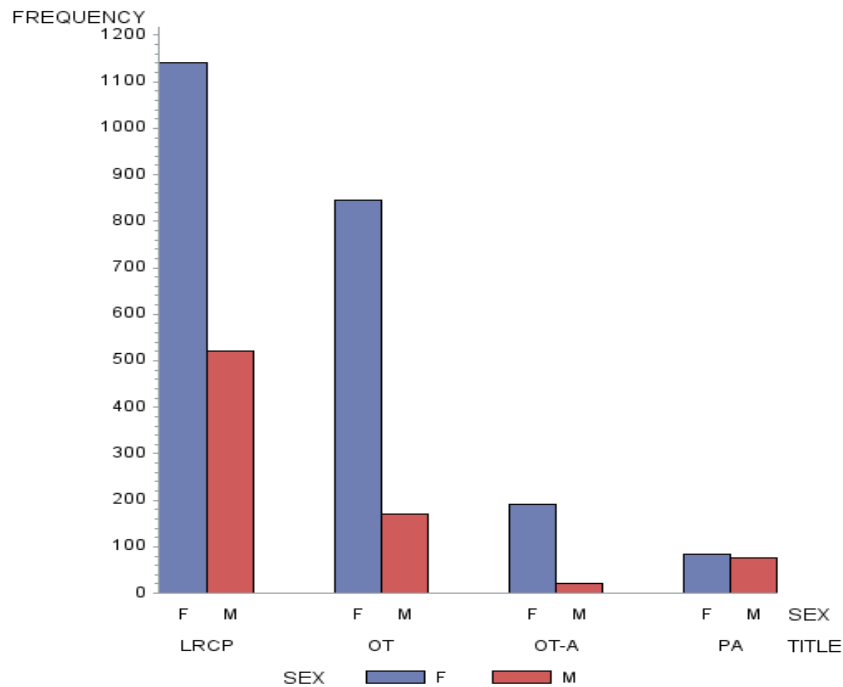
Health Related Professionals by Regions and Specialty

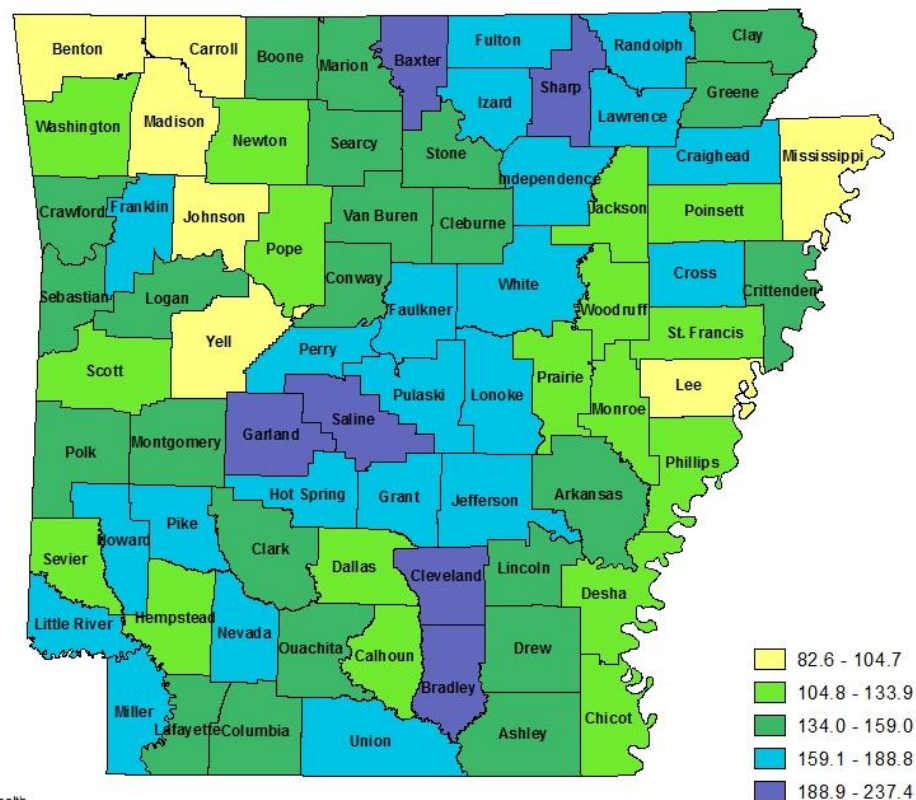

Nurses in Arkansas

In 2010, the Nursing Board licensed 45,285 nurses with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 155 per 10,000 populations. These 45,285 nurses had a total of 48,154 licenses but for the purposes of this report we used the following hierarchy to take the highest of the 5 license types: LPN < LPTN < RN < RNP < APN. The APNs consist of 4 different licenses but will be grouped together for the majority of this section. They will be broken down into individual licenses later in the section. The nursing total includes 28,590 Registered Nurses (RN), 14,430 Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN), 160 Licensed Psychiatric Technician Nurses (LPTN), 474 Registered Nurse Practitioners (RNP) and 1,631 nurses registered as Advanced Practice Nurses (APNs).

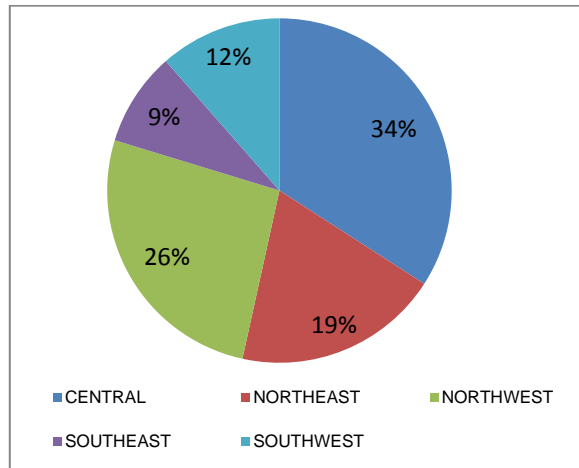
After completing basic nursing programs, RNs and LPNs must pass nationally standardized examinations. LPTNs must have passed a state licensure exam. RNP's have completed a nurse practitioner program in addition to their RN program. To be licensed as an APN, an RN must complete an advanced practice nursing program and hold certification from a Board approved nationally recognized certifying body.

Nurses by Counties Per 10,000 Population

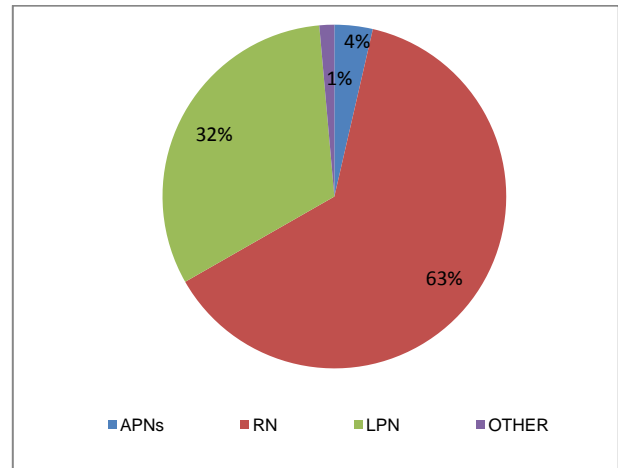

Distribution of Nurses by Title

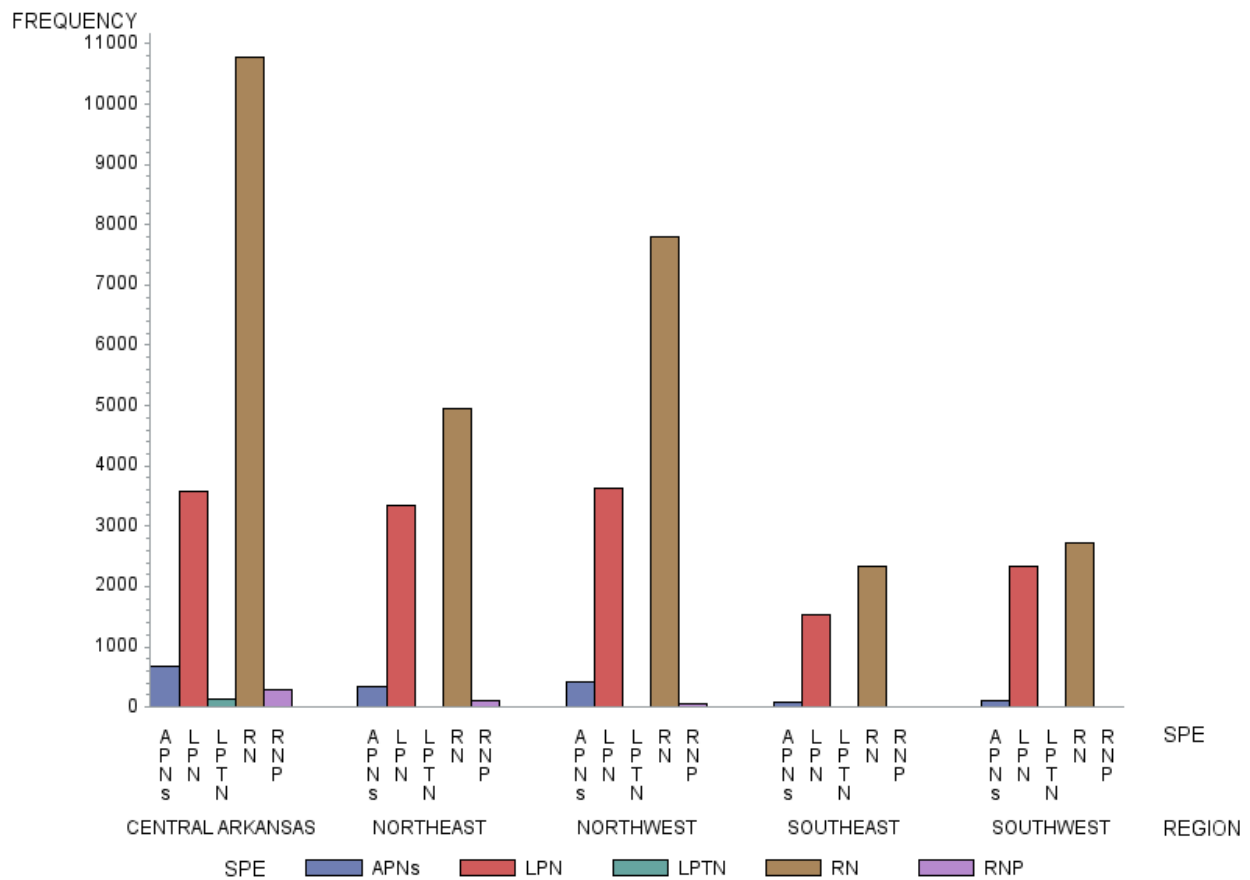

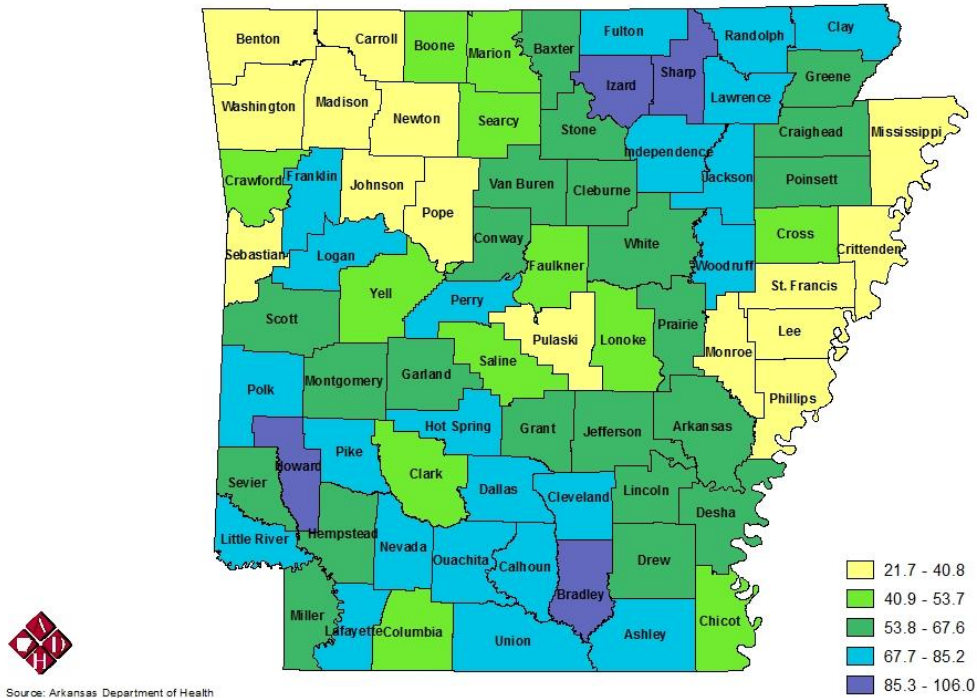

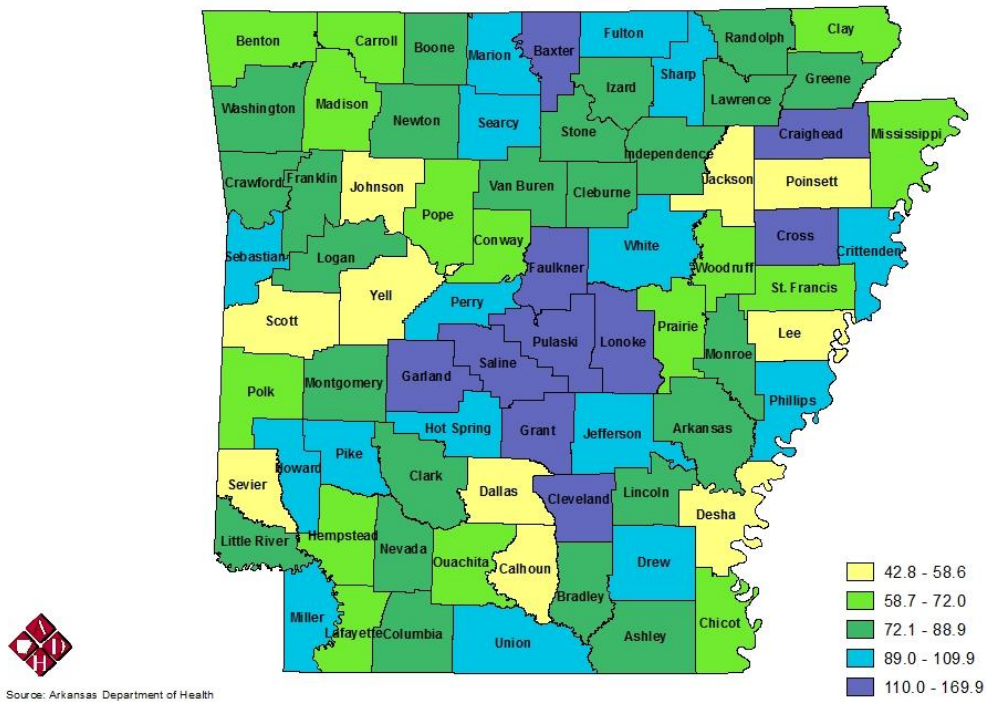
Nurses by Regions

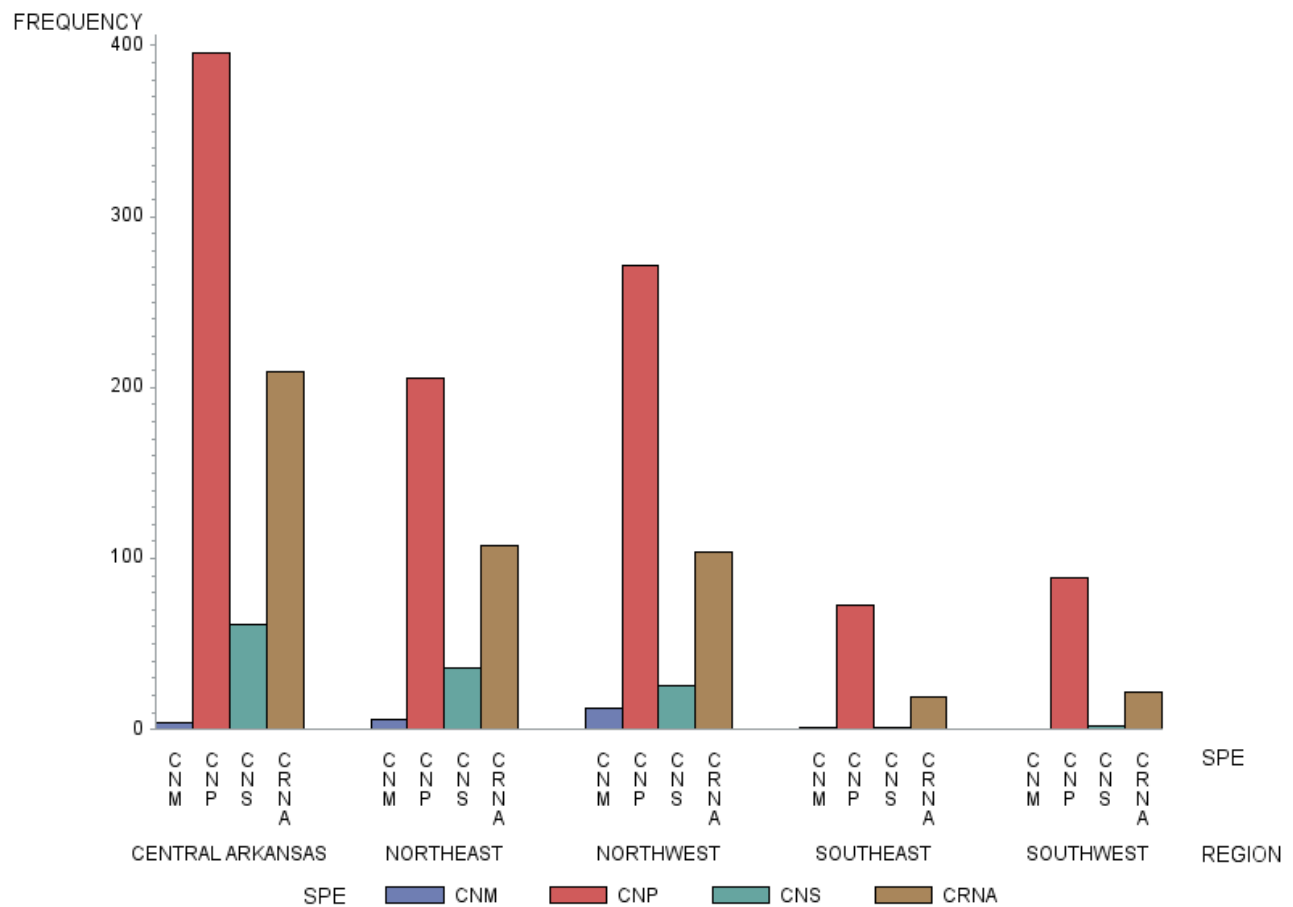

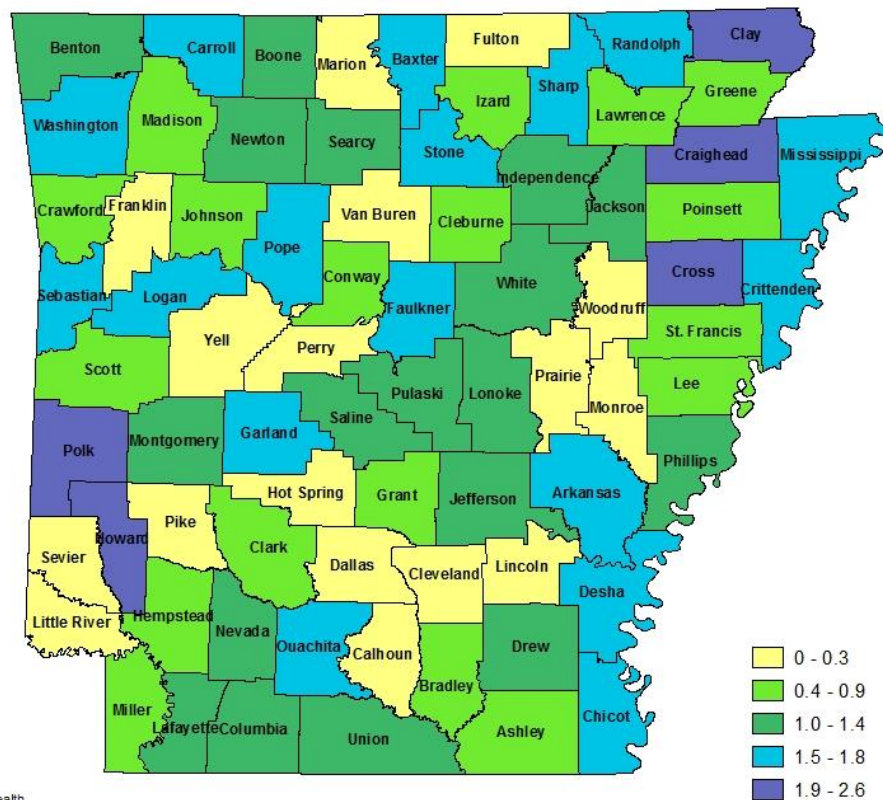

Optometrists by Counties Per 10,000 Population

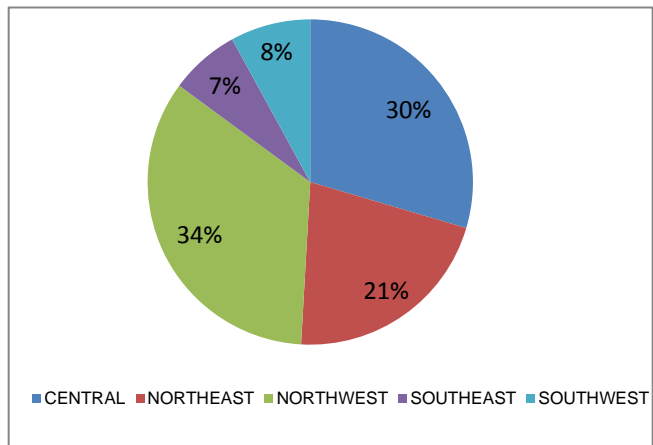

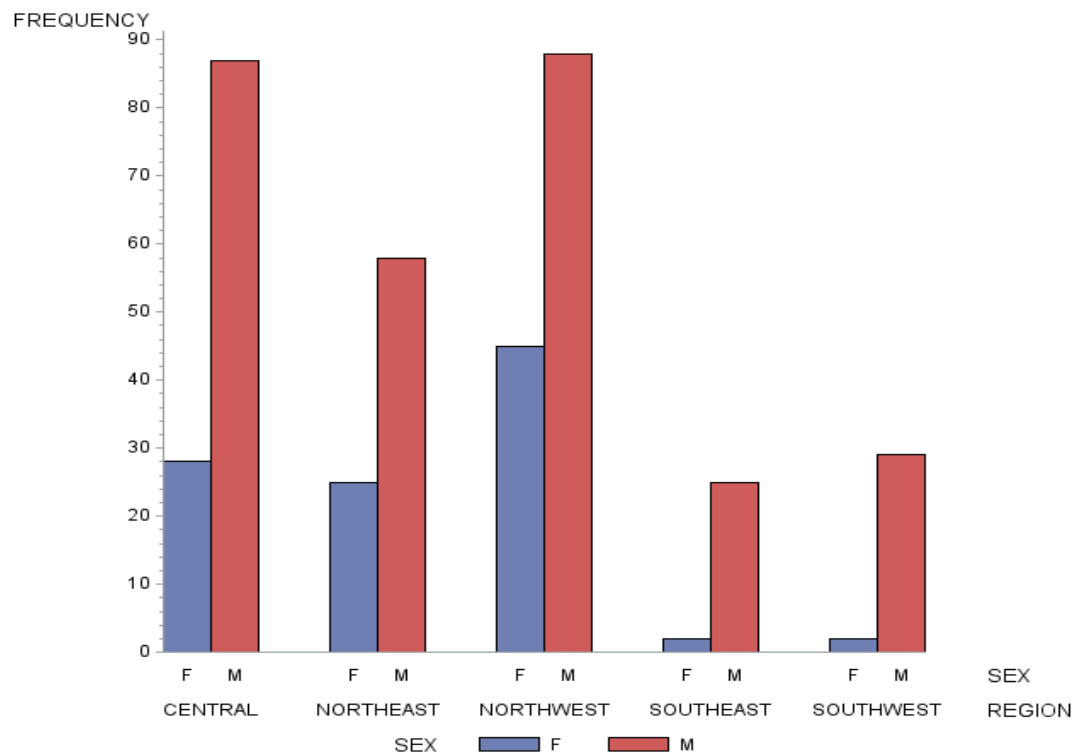

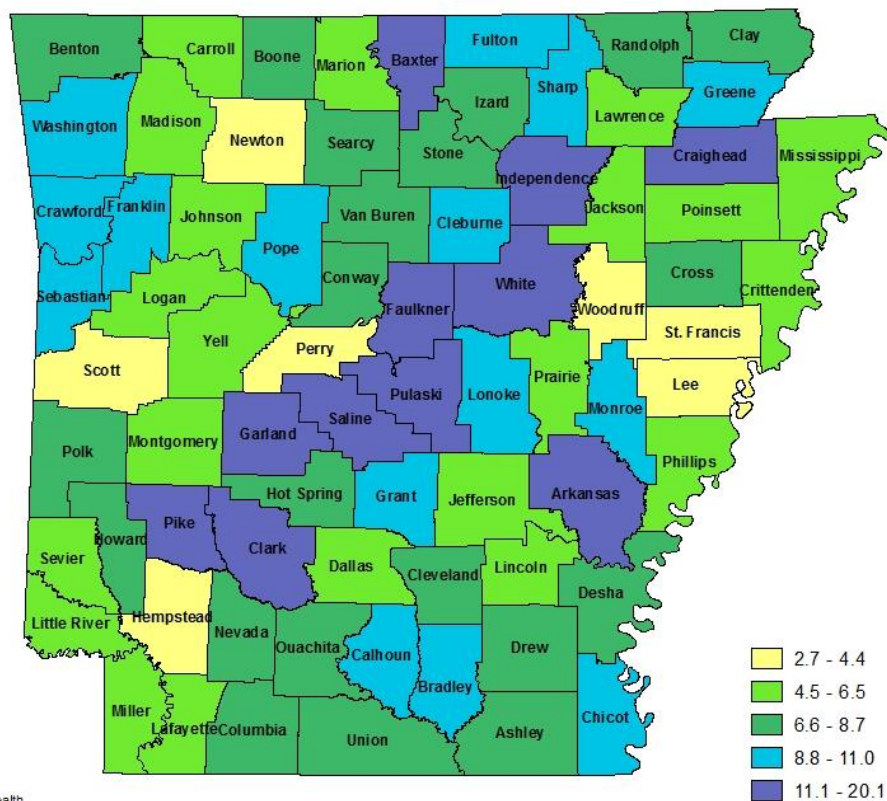

Pharmacists by Counties Per 10,000 Population

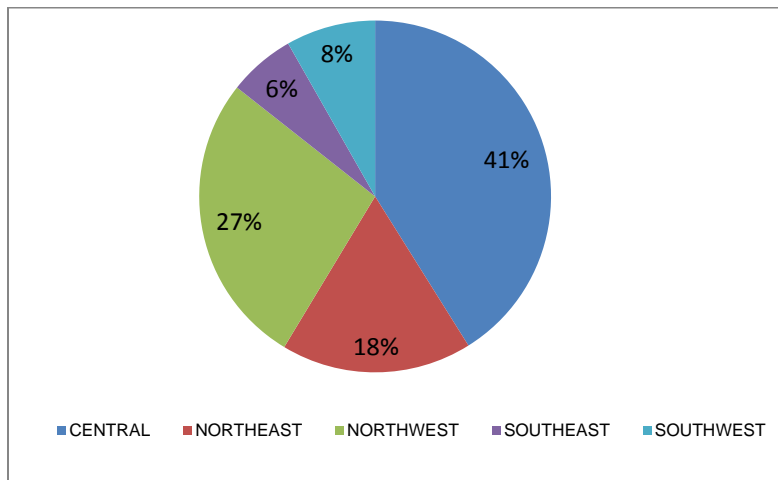

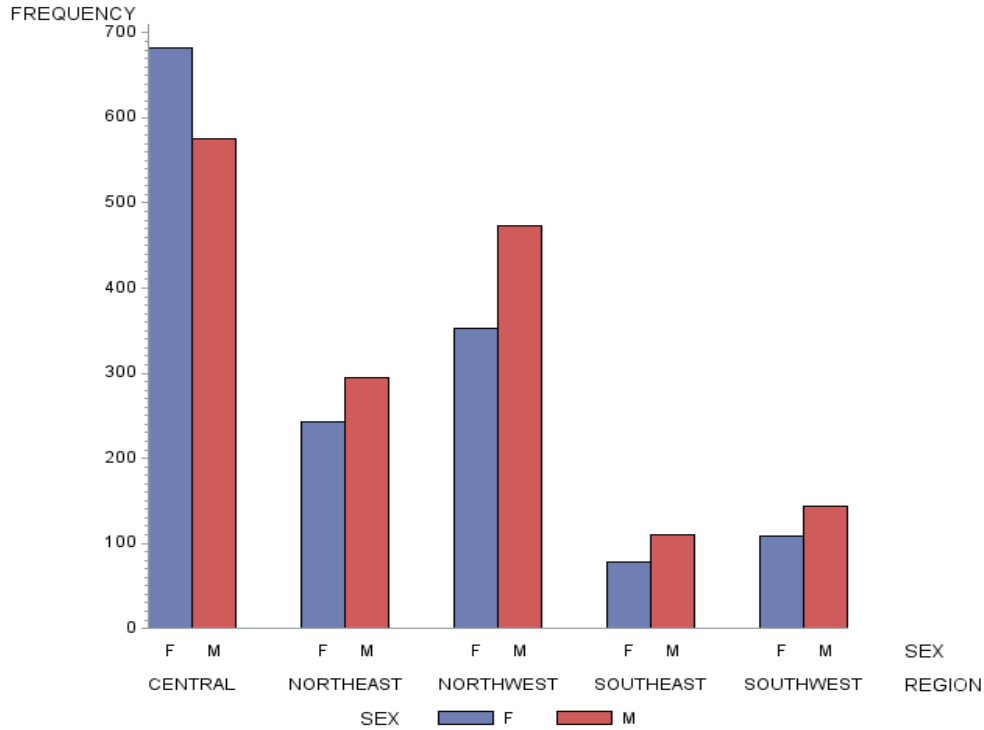

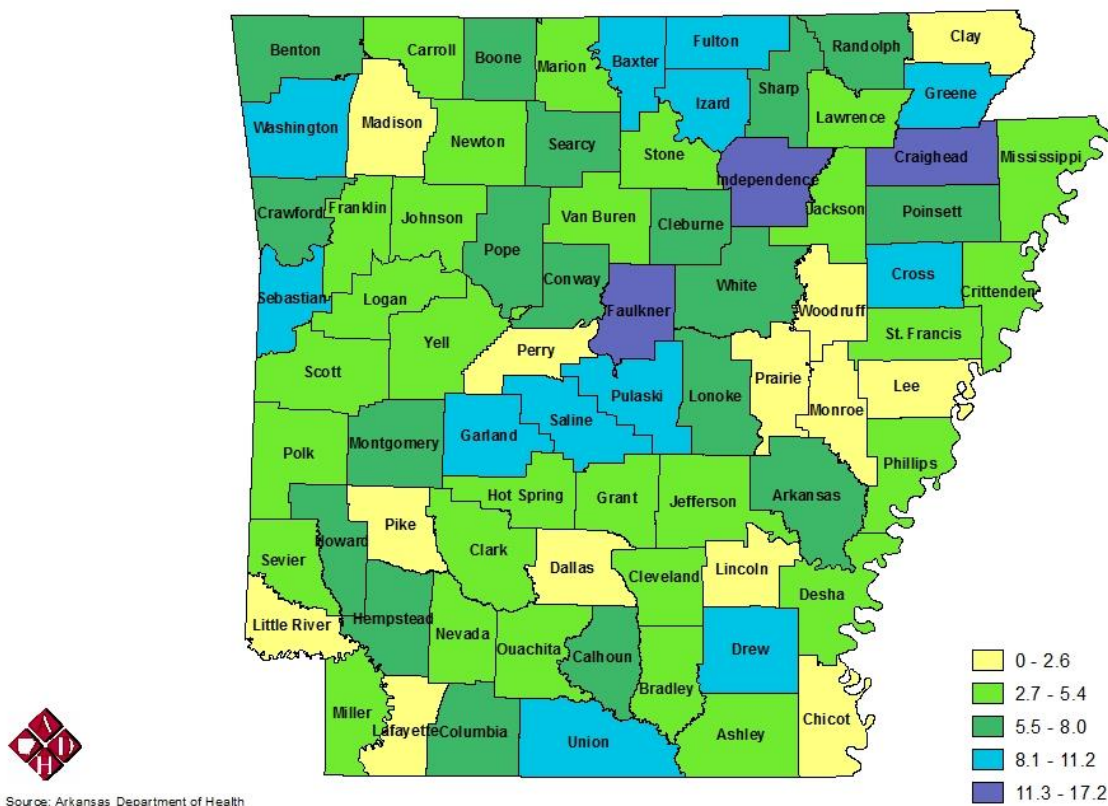

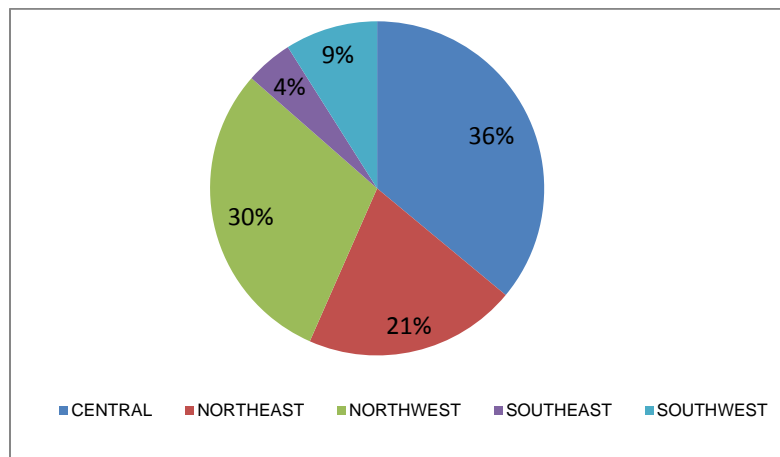
Physical Therapists by Counties Per 10,000 Population

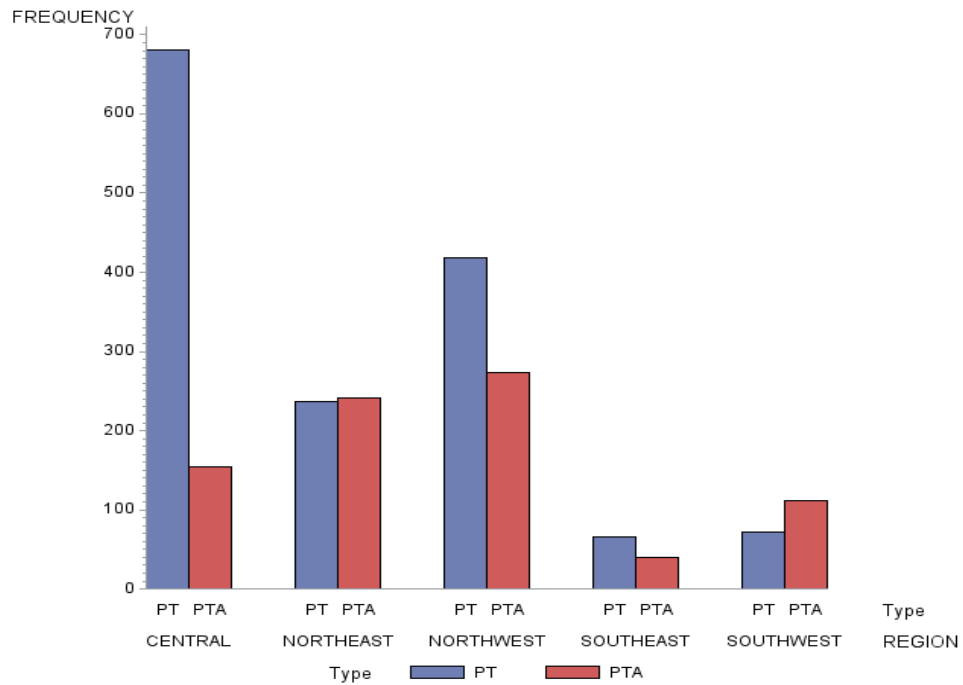

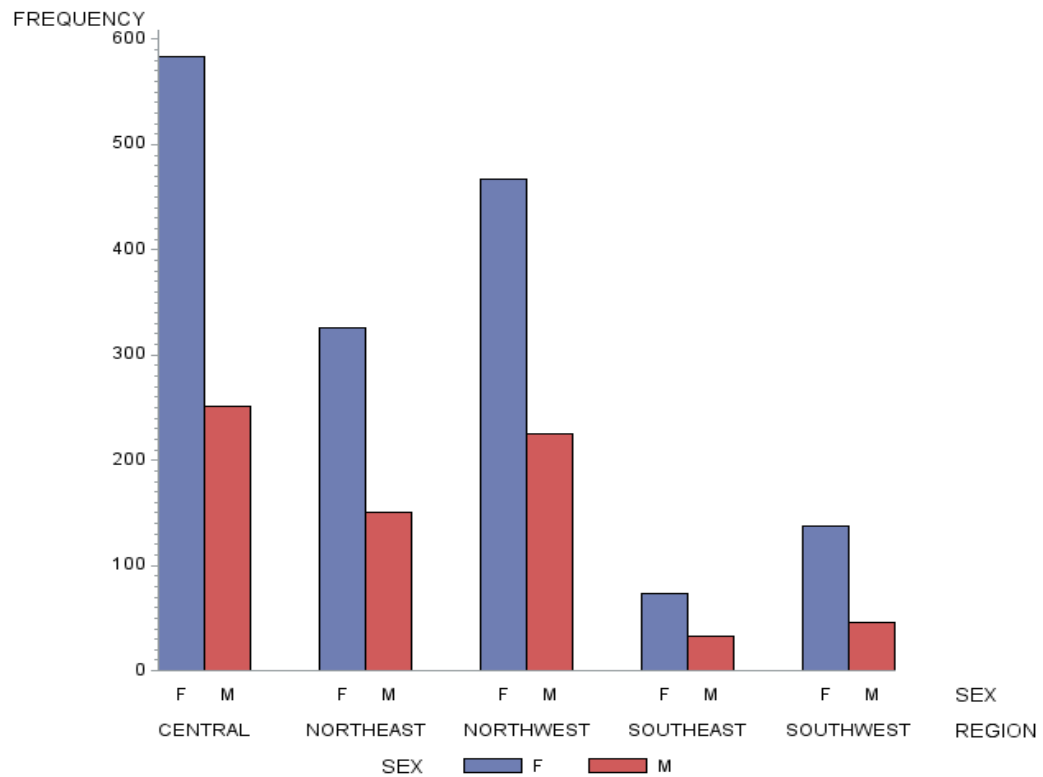

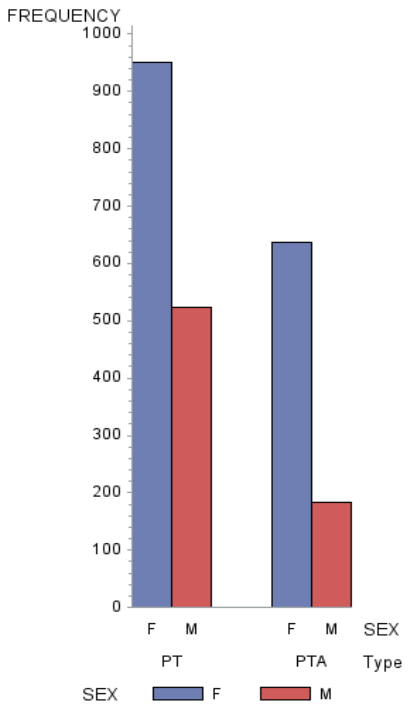
Physical Therapists by Regions

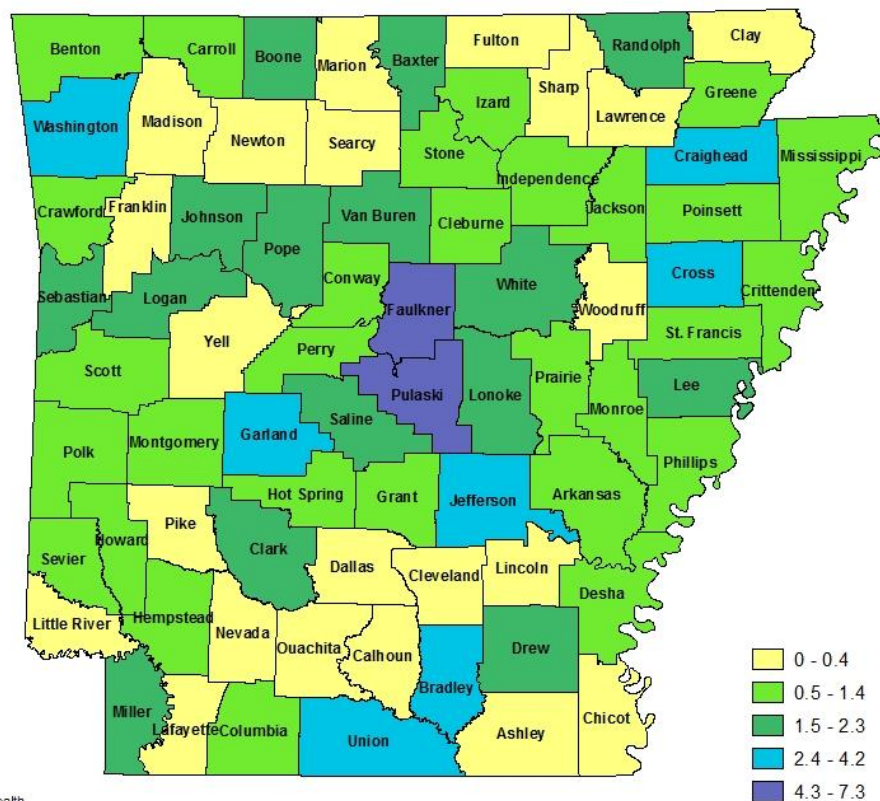

In 2010, the Psychology Board licensed 755 psychologists with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 2.6 per 10,000 populations. This total includes 413 Psychologists (P), 164 Psychologists Examiners (E), and 178 Psychological Examiner Independents (EI); about 1.4, 0.6 and 0.6 respectively, per 10,000 population. Of the 75 Arkansas counties, 20 (27%) did not have a registered psychologist and 11 (15%) of the counties had only one.

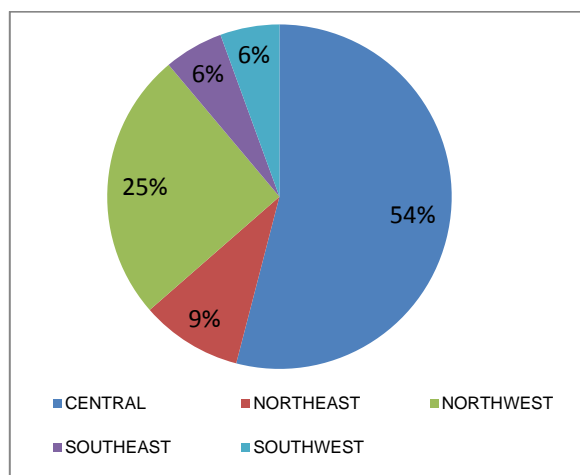
Psychologists by Counties Per 10,000 Population



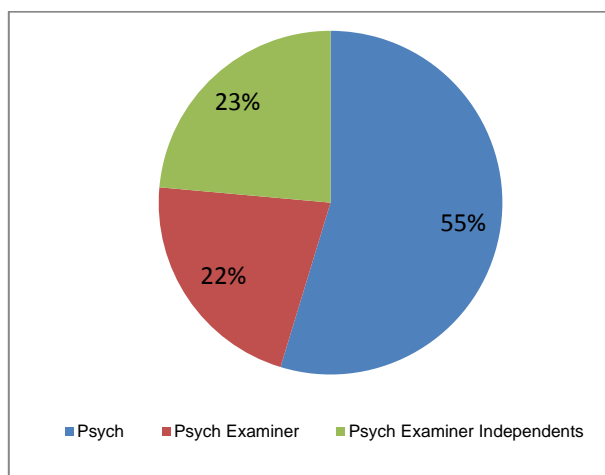

Distribution of Psychologists by Title

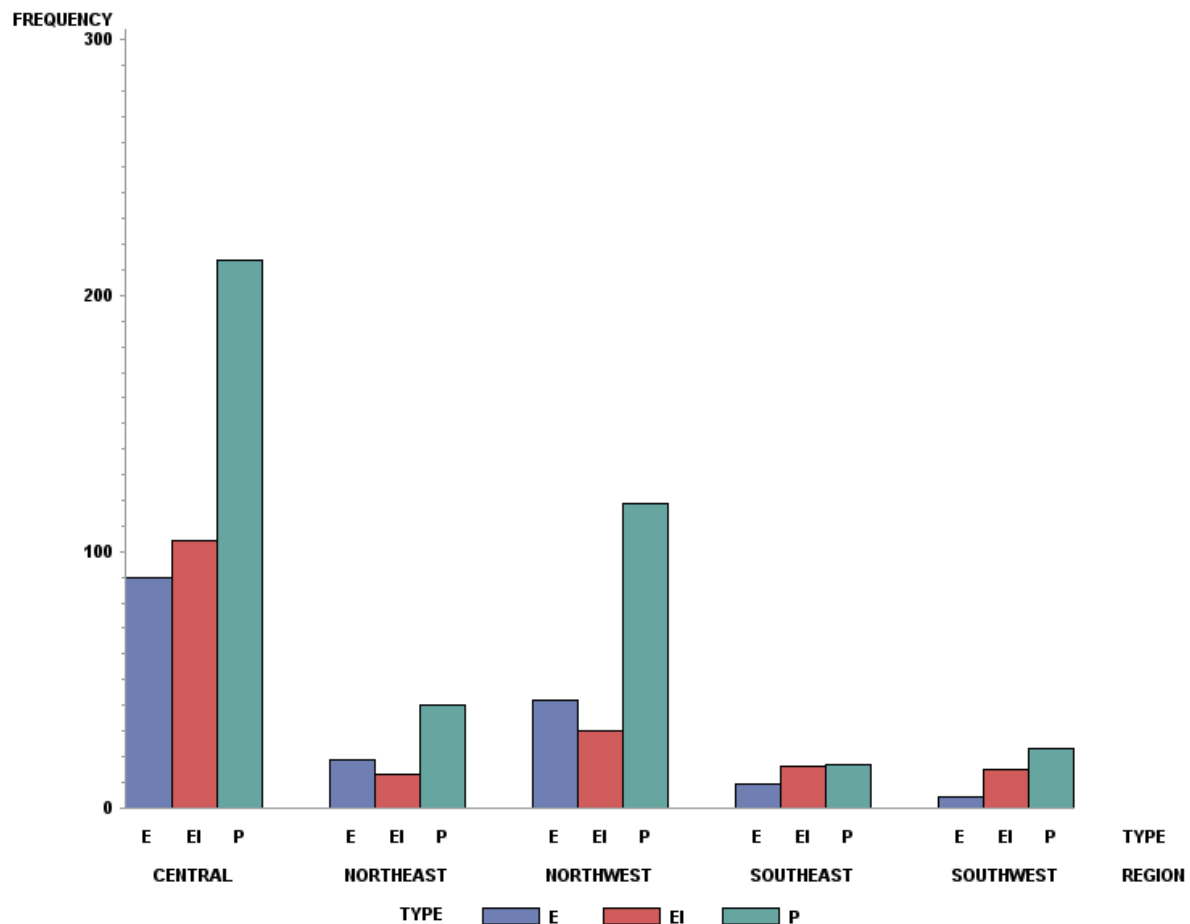

In 2010, the Social Work Licensing Board licensed 2,501 social workers with mailing addresses in Arkansas about 8.6 per 10,000 population. This total includes 498 social worker (LSW), 1,254 certified social workers (LCSW), and 610 master social workers (LMSW). In addition, the Social Worker Licensing Board issued 139 provisional licenses for social workers with mailing addresses in Arkansas (*provisional license for social workers means: First-time applicants for LSW or LMSW licensure will be issued a provisional license upon approval of his or her application. A provisional license will be issued one time per person and expire exactly one-year from the date of issuance. Provisional licensing is prohibited at the LCSW level.*). This total includes 42 Provisional license social workers (PLSW), and 97 provisional license master social workers (PLMSW). At least one fully licensed social worker was licensed in each of the Arkansas counties with the exception of Calhoun and Little River counties.

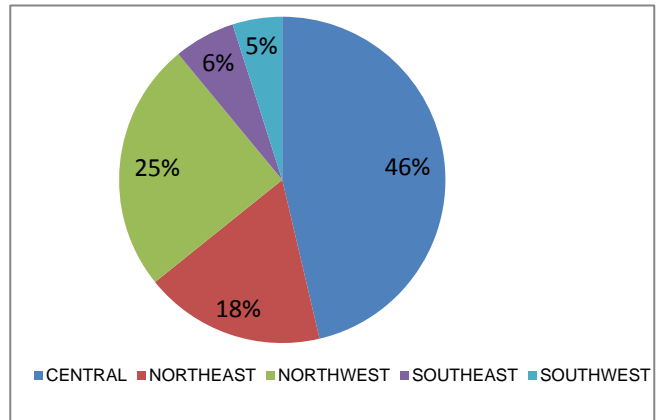

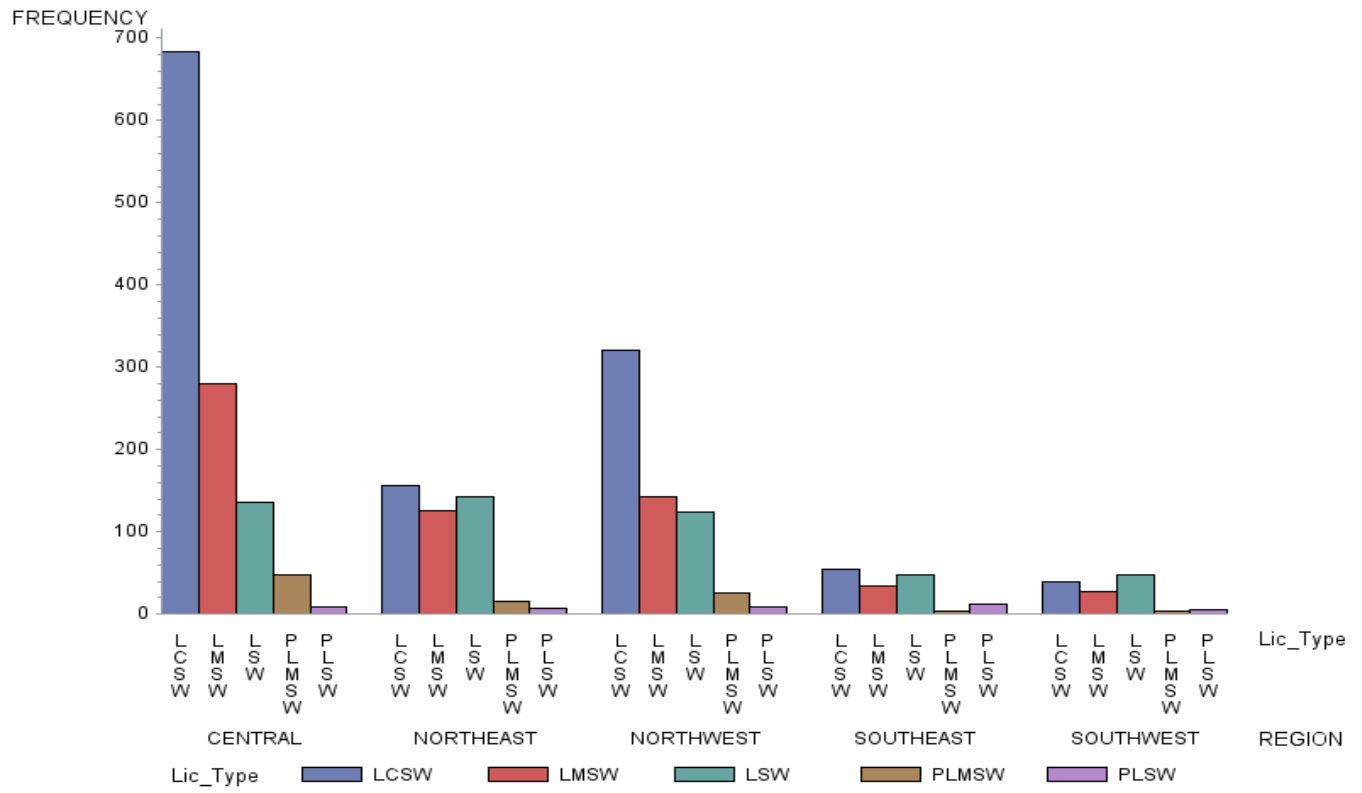

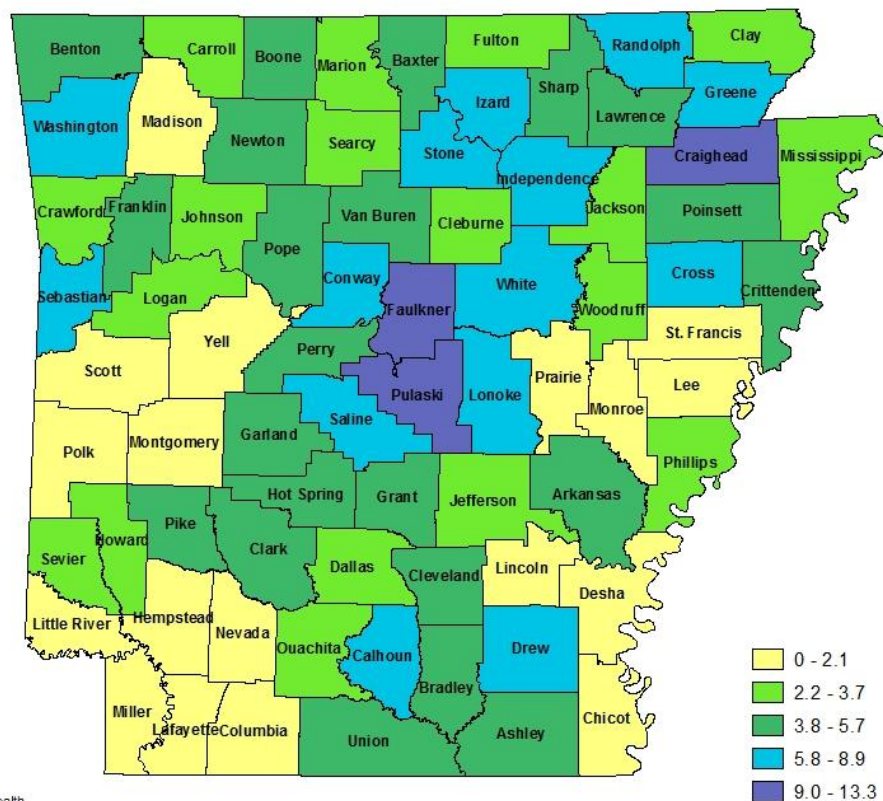

Speech Pathologists and Audiologists in Arkansas

In 2010, the Speech Pathology and Audiology Board licensed 1,749 speech pathologists, about 6 per 10,000 population, and 113 audiologists, about 0.4 per 10,000 population, with mailing addresses in Arkansas. Of the 75 counties in Arkansas, 1 (1.3%) counties had no registered speech pathologists or audiologists and 54 (72%) counties had one or more speech pathologists but no audiologists in the registry.

Per 10,000 Population**

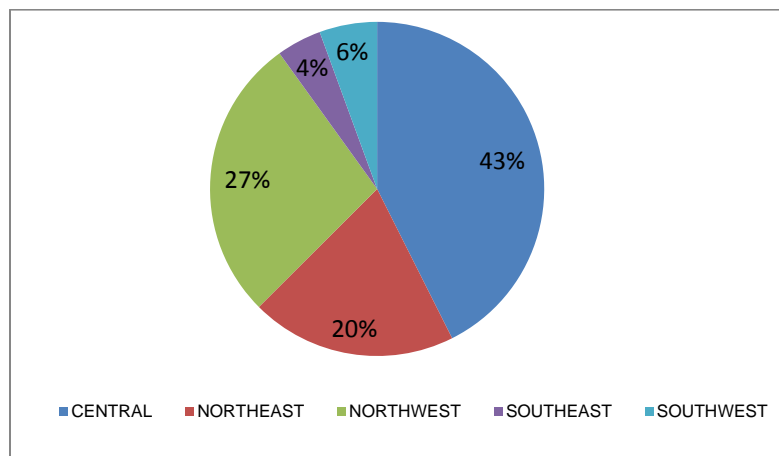


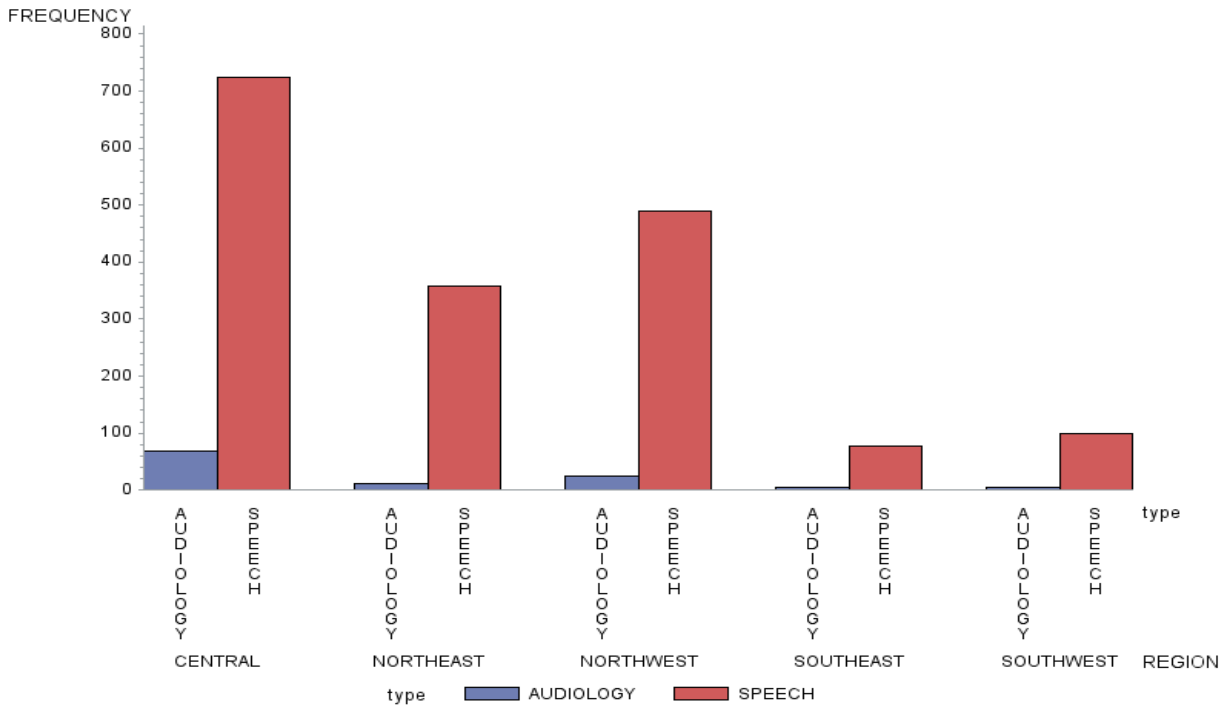
