Question 1: How many years will the PPYC grantee be funded? It is understood that each year the grantee may be asked to provide updated work plans and budgets, but will this funding be awarded for seven (7) years as it was in the past?

Answer Question 1: (Program place answer here please)

The proposed effective period is expected to be July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. The contract may be extended for up to six (6) additional one-year increments contingent upon collaboration with ADH/TPCP of the work plan, review by the state legislature, and the availability of funding.

Funding for this program is made available through the Master Tobacco Settlement Agreement. Therefore, in accordance with Section 6 of Act 88 of 2017, the State of Arkansas is not obligated to continue funding any commitment paid from the proceeds of the Tobacco Settlement in the event that Tobacco Settlement funds are not sufficient.
